





Poor planning, not the potential for ecological damage, is the reason why the Regional Planning Committee is appealing a Halton Land Division Committee (LDC) decision to allow a home to be built near Rattlesnake Point. An Ontario Municipal Board hearing will likely be

called to hear the appeal. The LDC decision would permit severance of a oneacre parcel of land on No. 12 Sideroad from an 18.8

acre parcel.

The land is owned by Gord Hasselfeldt of Milton and is located just east of Walker's Line, north of Derry Rd. Mr. Hasselfeldt wants to build a house on the severed land.




