Safety Council honors attendant, guard

A 27-year-old Milton man has been honored for his part in saving the life of a traffic accident victim. Marcel Zwolman was honored at an awards ceremony held recently by the Halton Region Safety Council.

Mr. Zwolman was one of the first on the scene last May when Gary Arpa, 24, of Milton lost control of his car on First Line and crashed into a tree.

An ambulance attendant with the Halton-Mississauga Ambulance Co., Mr. Zwolman was off duty and on his way home when he came upon the accident.

Mr. Arpa lay trapped in the back seat of the badly

mangled car, barely alive.

"He was breathing very poorly," said Mr. Zwolman and choking on blood.

He managed to get to the trapped victim and administer first aid and keep him breathing until an ambulance arrived.

Mr. Zwolman is credited with saving the life of Mr. Arpa, who suffered extensive head and internal injuries. Nearly one year later, he remains in Milton District Hospital recovering from the accident.

Mr. Zwolman, modest about his efforts, said anyone with first aid knowledge "would have known what to do."

"But it is nice to receive some recognition," he said.

"A compliment or thank-you is really nice."

Mr. Zwolman was among several Halton residents to receive commendation from the safety council.

Sandra Ford, also of Milton, was named crossing guard of the year by Halton Region Police Safety Constable Raj Swaminathan.

Mrs. Ford, a resident of Milton for the past four years, is a school crossing guard at Woodward Ave. and Wilson Dr.

William Little, chairman of the council made the presentation of awards.

False fire good news

Investigating officers determined three separate fires were set in the house. It had been unoccupied for sometime, according to Chief Coulson.

satisfied with the proposed shopping area to be built by Ricenberg Developments.

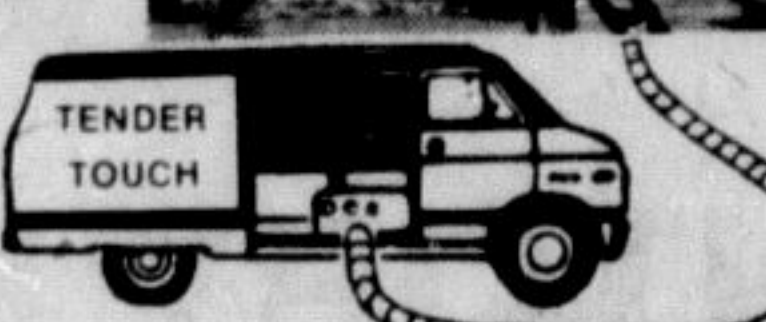
Ricenberg has met and agreed to all changes in the original plan which were reviewed and recommended to the developer by the staff.

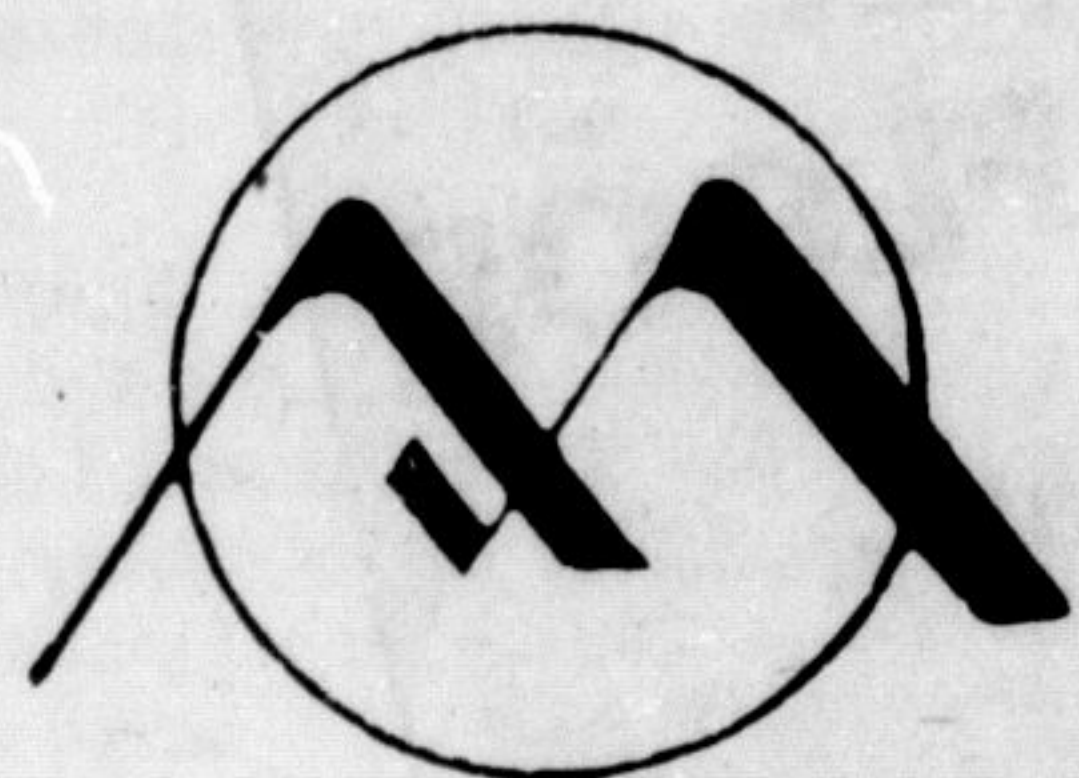

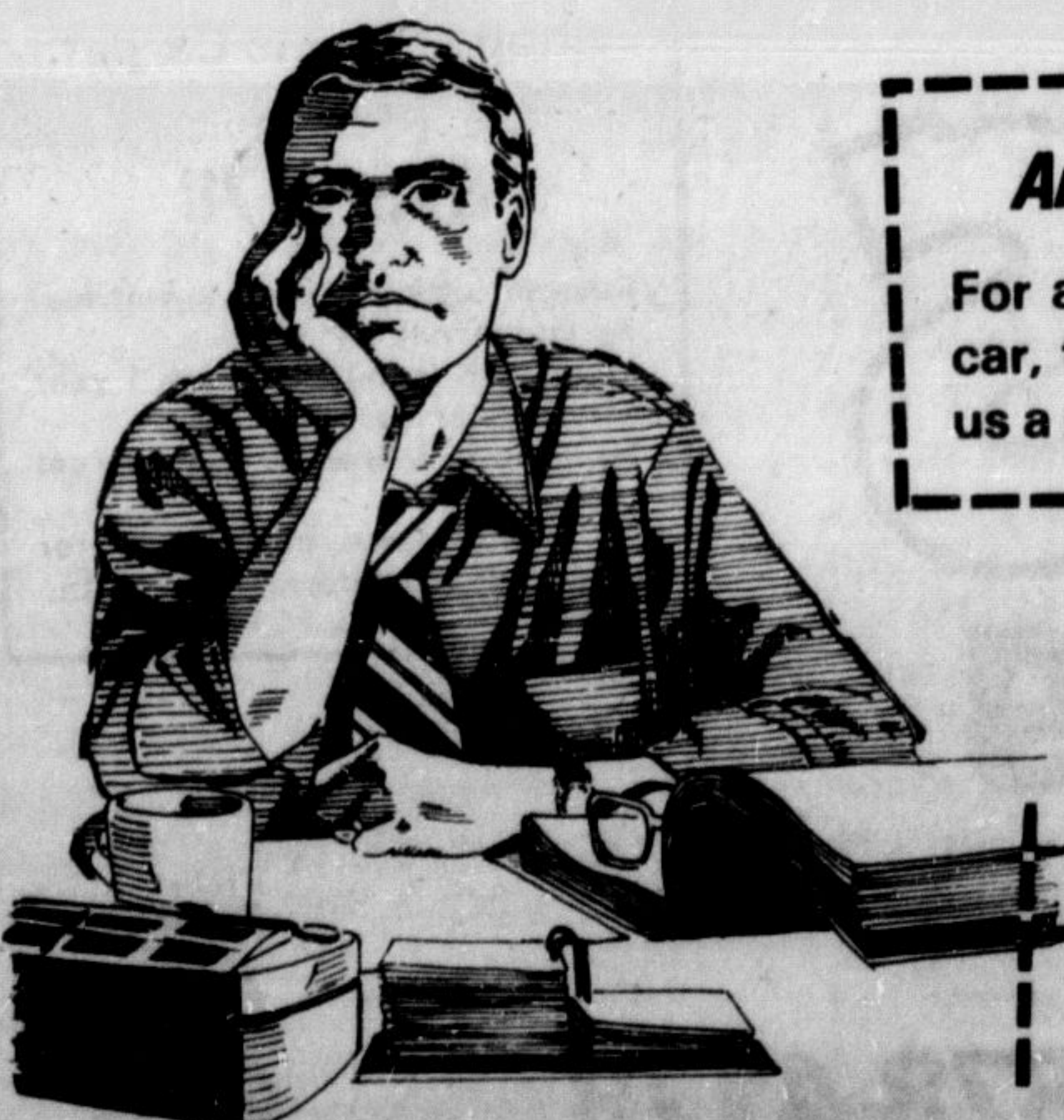

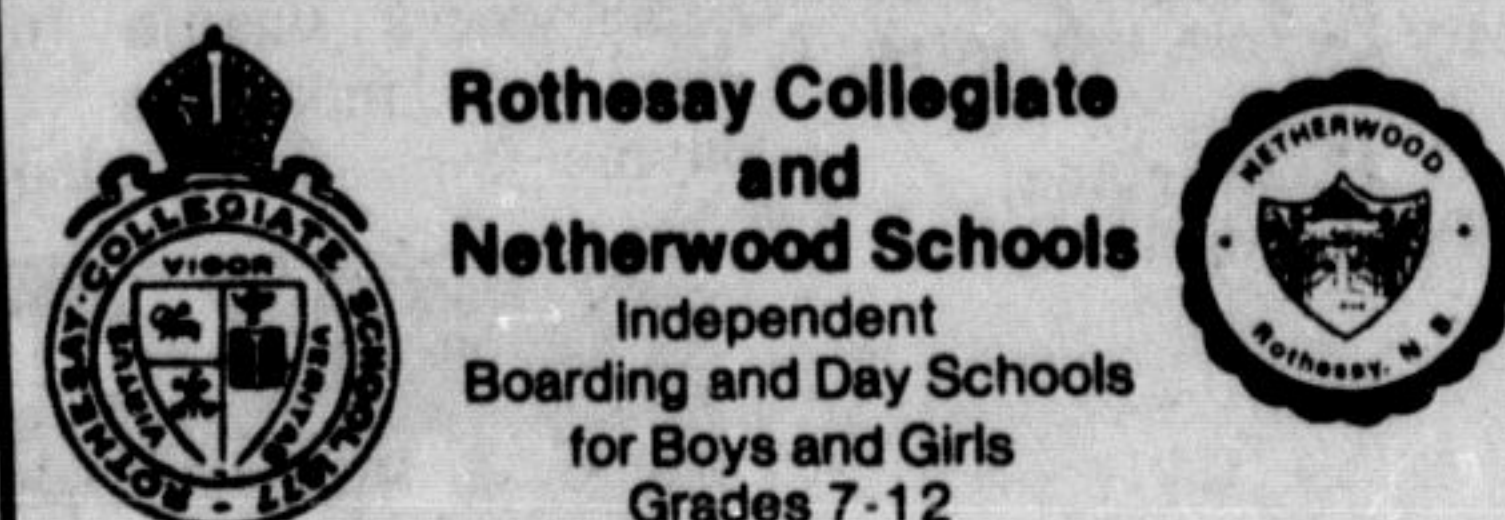
Asphalt plant clears hurdle

Committee of the Whole has recommended the Sherman Sand and Gravel Asphalt Plan be approved, subject to several restrictions.

Milton council was to have voted last night on advising the Niagara Escarpment Commission the Town of Milton will support the application for an asphalt pit so that the NEC can officially be notified of Milton's position.

This approval comes with the stipulations that all Ministry of the Environment requirements are met: that truck traffic to and from the site due to the operation will not increase significantly; and that the asphalt plan is not extended beyond the life of the sand and gravel operation now going on in the same area.
