Guide to selecting wedding flowers

Toasts to happiness and health, prosperity and love — this is the language of the wedding celebration.

Your wedding flowers will say what you want them to for the price you can afford if you learn yet another tongue: the language of the florist.

This means describing your forthcoming wedding in as much detail as possible in order for the florist to arrange flowers that reflect your tastes.

Working together

A good florist recognizes that each wedding is born from the feelings of the bride and groom-to-be, and is willing to discuss their plans and whims.

The first question you're likely to be asked by the florist is: what colors are the bride's and bridesmaids' gowns? Be equipped to answer with swatches of material.

If you rely merely on description ("Well . . .

my gown is sort of pinkish-yellowish-beige-ish"), the florist might arrange a bridal bouquet of salmon-colored carnations to match a gown that's really coral. Disastrous.

The next question is: what sort of mood do you want to set?

A formal, traditional atmosphere is enchanced by tall and imposing gladioluses, large potted plants, deep red roses next to crisp white babies'-breath and exotic flowers such as orchids with intricately curled petals.

By contrast, sprays of daisies, carnations and pert bachelor buttons create an atmosphere that's casual and playful.

Before you can discuss table decorations for the reception hall and flowers for the church.

the florist will want to visit these places with you to get a feel for their design. It's best if you can supply the florist with floor plans.

Discuss costs

Finally, state clearly and directly what you plan to spend, and the florist will determine what can be done for the price. There's no average cost for wedding flowers because there'no average wedding.

Total costs depend on the kinds of flowers and number of bouquets desired, their sizes ad their styles. Traditional round clutches cost less than intricate cascades or bouquets with built-in corsages.

The heights of the bride and bridemaids are other determining factors. Tall women need large bouquets, whereas women with small builds can get away with small, less expensive cluthes.

One way to reduce church and reception decorations is to order small arrangements, instead of lavish, grandiose ones, and set them on pedestals. Many churches and reception halls can provide them.

Flowers in season are the best bargains because florists are well stocked with them and can easily order more.

Shop around before choosing a florist. Get more than one estimate of price. Talk to newly wedded friends about their florists.

Choosing the cake

The cutting of the cake is a traditional feature of the wedding reception. Family and friends take special notice of the beauty in this symbol of union.

When everyone takes a bite of your wedding cake, they will be sharing in the joy of the occasion. You will want your cake to be attractive to look at as well as satisfying to the palate.

Start shopping the bakeries as soon as you set the date. Consider professional bakers and friends of the family as well.

A home-made cake can be just as delicious as one purchased from a store.

Consider the cake offered in your caterer's reception package. It's often cheaper and more convenient than shopping for one on your own.
