HRCA changes its mind now backs asphalt plant

Halton Region Conservation Authority has over-ruled a committee decision backing the Niagara Escarpment Commission's denial of an as-

phalt plant on Derry Rd. Instead, the Authority has given its support to Sherman Sand and Gravel to develop the plant on the condition the company observes specific water quality, landscaping and aesthetic standards.

An appeal by Sherman Sand and Gravel is scheduled for April 23. David Greenfield, an environmental specialist and chairman of the Rattlesnake Point Citizens' Group, pleaded

with HRCA members Thursday evening to oppose the land use "conflict."

Mr. Greenfield said the proposed plant will "ser-

iously affect" enjoyment of the nearby Rattlesnake Point conservation area, and said development of the plant didn't make sense.

Breast clinic here on May 3

Milton Branch of the Canadian Cancer Society and Milton Medical Society will sponsor a breast examination and teaching clinic Saturday, May 3 in the classroom at Milton District Hospital. The clinic is open to all women, is free of charge and will run from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Last year 2,300 women in Ontario discovered they had cancer of the breast, which is the highest cause of mortality in women. This cancer can be treated successfully in most cases where it is diagnosed in its early stages.

Women should know the proper way to examine their own breasts for lumps which could be cancerous, and perform these examinations once a month. The free clinic May 3 will feature a movie called Decision which demonstrates the Breast

Self Examination (BSE) technique. A registered nurse will then give women private instruction on BSE, and a free booklet illustrating the technique will also be available.

The majority of breast lumps, 85 per cent, are benign and cause no need for concern. Women who practise BSE are able to recognize early changes in breast tissue, and if these changes should represent cancer, the sooner it is treated, the better.

Donna Elliott of the Milton branch of the Cancer Society will go to Milton District High School this week to speak with the female students. She is concerned that with many young women using the pill, they should be aware they are in a high risk bracket where breast cancer is concerned, and she will urge them to attend the clinic.

Chamber seeks a new manager

Milton Chamber of Commerce will hire a new office manager, the second in three weeks.

The position was given originally to Kay Biggar, but illness has caused her to give up the job she held for two weeks.

Mrs. Biggar served the Chamber as office manager for only a few days when she was taken to hospital for tests.

The results of these tests prompted her doctor to insist she not continue working.

The duties of office manager for the Chamber of Commerce are to help organize events of the Chamber, and participate in some of these, as well as present a good impression of Milton to the people who use the information service provided by the Chamber.
