

Fisherman's luck - not really

Have you ever heard of fishermen's luck? Of course you have. That's what the other guy says it's good and what you have if it's bad.

Some fishermen are more successful than others, but it isn't just because of luck. Like any other sport, knowledge and techniques are very important factors to consistently catch fish.

One good way to enhance your catch is to learn one body of water well and stick with it until it pays off. We're sure Smitty, Don, Lorne, Jim, Laverne, Jack or any other dedicated fishermen have spent many hours around Ganaraska, Thornbury, Meaford and Lake Ontario out from Bronte, searching and learning the whereabouts of shoals, deep holes and the like.

Just the same way, Joe Winder and yours truly have spent the last 15 years studying Sturgeon Lake in search of walleye, muskie and bass.

Learn to use live bait, where permitted, and how to present it. Learn the use of at least three basic lures and how to present them.

Learn the time when the fish you want feed best. Most species feed early in the day or late evening in hot weather.

Last but not least, learn the proper way of handling and caring for fishing equipment. Then, go to your favorite lake or stream and polish up your technique.

To keep peace and harmony in the family of fishermen, learn how to cope with your wife. There are a few rules we've learned over the past years.

Among the rules are, a) Take your wife with you, b) send her and the kids home to mother for a few days, c) phone her when you get to the lake, d) buy her a new skirt, e) bring her home a small gift. If none of these work, you are in trouble.

One long-suffering angler's wife once told me that most dedicated fishermen have a small

Take his advice, especially if you have a flat-bottomed boat.

Noise travels fast in the water. Carpeting the bottom of the boat helps deaden the noise of noisy minnow buckets and tackle boxes.

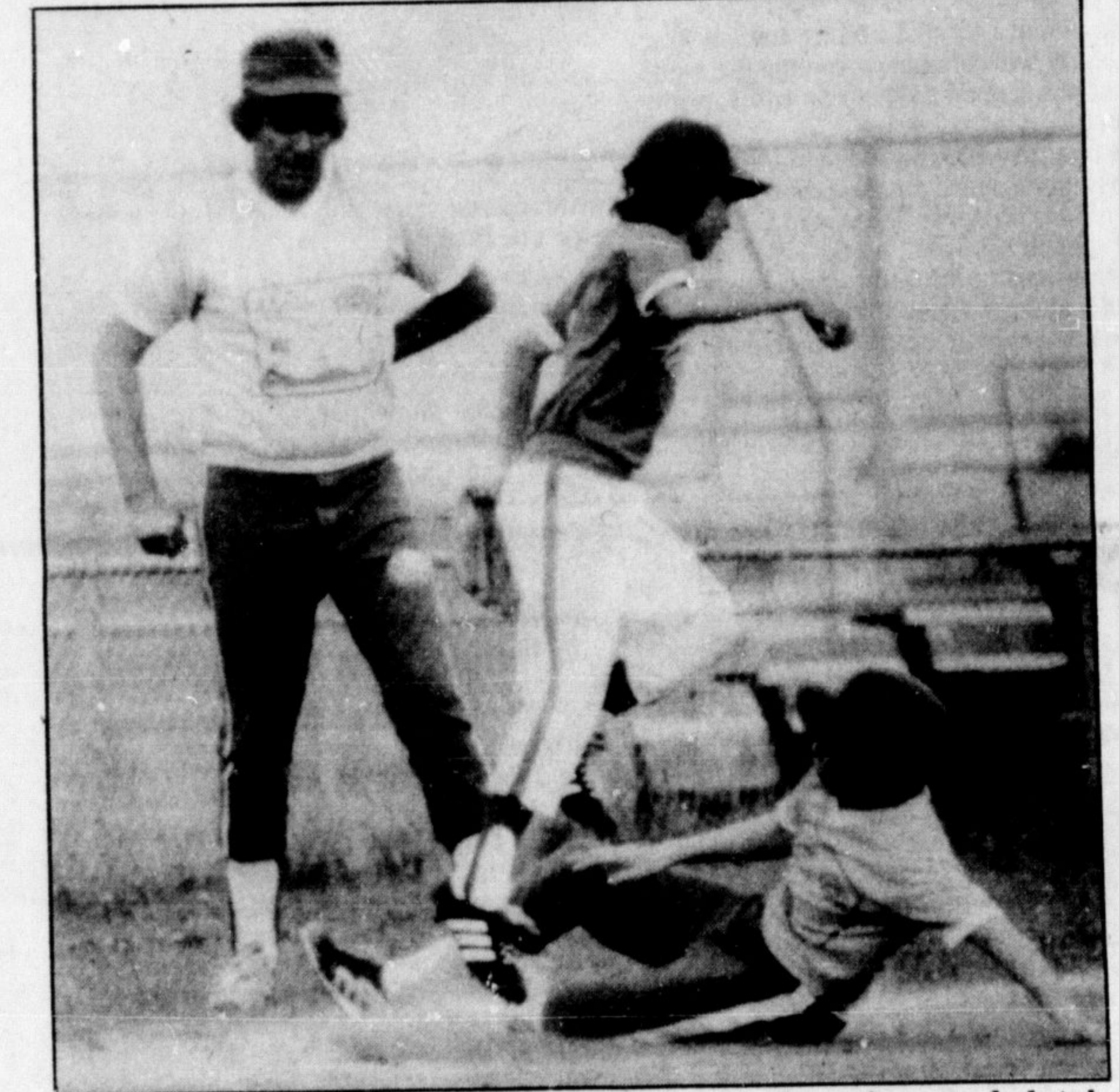
Johnson came up with two good plays, one at Shortstop and one at second base to stifle Oakville rallies.
