DON'T GAMBLE

One of the most valuable lessons anyone can learn is to play within your own ability. Don't gamble on a hundred-to-one shot. Most weekend golfers atte npt shots, that a pro would think twice about.

Don't try and wedge the ball over a bunker to a narrow neck of green when a safe pitch shot to the fat part will assure you of a run at the hole.

Be content to drop a shot if you find yourself in a difficult situation.

If you duff a tee shot on a long par four don't pull out a three wood and try to hit it 245 yards, over sand and water.

Instead, hit a mid iron into position for an easy third shot.


Now you at least have a chance at rolling in a par or at the worst a bogey. Always tee up on the same side as the trouble. Then hit away from it. This gives you the whole fairway to work with.

You will sometimes find yourself in the rough no matter what kind of game you play. If the grass is long, and the ball is sitting down in it, forget about distance. Take a lofted iron and get the ball back on the fairway. The long grass will slow the clubhead down and a long iron or wood will not get the ball out.

When you are in a bunker around the green, with no lip or long grass between you and the pin, putt it out. Don't make the shot any harder than it is. Be honest with yourself and think your way to lower scores.
