Pento's four goals keep Alpini on track

Tulio Pento fired four goals and Chris Christophose added five assists to pace Alpini ICCM to a 6-0 triumph over Georgetown Meteors Wednesday, which clinched the club at least a first-place tie in the Inter-County Soccer League.

Alpini leads second-placed Meteors by six points with three games to play. However, in goal differential, Alpini has a plus of 42 while Meteors are minus one meaning Alpini is all but assured of finishing first.

In other action last week, Schwarz-Weiss handed Milton Rangers 5-1 while Ajax was the latest team to clobber Rockwell, this time by a 7-0 score.

"They never had a prayer," said Alpini player and team president Renato Poloni. "We played our positional game and we had the ball

most of the time. I think they had three chances altogether and their best chance came from mid-field."

One of the team's top players, Marco Bernabe, substituted in goal when neither of the two regular goalies showed up for the game.

Poloni said the work of his mid-fielders, especially Christophose, was excellent throughout the contest and contained the play well in the Meteors' territory.

Aside from Pento's four goals, Cory Hovinga and Gord Barkley added singles.

Iggy Maynard scored Milton Rangers' lone goal in the loss to Schwarz-Weiss while undermanned Rockwell, with just eight players, lost another game by a lopsided score.

Shuffle players to house

To the editor:
 It is with an intense feeling of remorse I find it necessary to write when many voluntary hours are put in by numerous adults, but this letter involves 12-year-old youngsters and how adults can turn a poor situation into a political rharub. I'm referring to the Milton Youth Soccer Association handling of the major mosquito rep team.

It is unfortunate space cannot be devoted to the entire three or four month history of the team, but from the onset the team should not have been fielded. In the late spring, there were eight players (of the 15 needed) showing their intention of playing rep.

The game of Wednesday, July 23, saw eight players reporting for action. Of these players, one was moving out of town, some still had family vacations scheduled and some had the month of August booked for hockey school of all things. Coach Davies could not be assured of any house league substitutes and obviously felt a team could not be fielded with less than seven players.

MYSC President John Morgan was at the game and I asked if the players that had signed up for the season of soccer could not be accommodated in some other way? "No" was the answer, "they were too good for house league and besides there were no sweaters available." I asked about pee wee (13 year olds). "No, none were good enough for that team." I was floored. Here were 12-year-olds willing to play soccer, willing to represent Milton for whatever reason and the MYSC could not see fit to accommodate players caught in their executive blunder! Coach Davies lobbied the President to allow my son a Sunday game with the pee wee rep. team. After that game, Morgan suggested players were

available from house league, the coaches would be changed and the Mosquito reps, would play in Bolton on July 31.

The Bolton team, not exactly high in the league standing, walked over the Milton squad something like 11-to-1. Although the idea of fair play is not necessarily to win, surely a team that cannot tally a goal game after game, a team without a single point after 13 or 14 starts, deserves a serious review on the part of the soccer executive committee. The youngsters are not learning soccer only humility.

The Champion quoted President Morgan in a July 30 article, "I felt we had an obligation to the sponsors, the players and the league to complete the season and we'll do that." The obligation appears only to favor the aspirations of the local executive. The team is outclassed in every respect and in carrying on is not only a disservice to the Milton players and the sponsors, but also the opposing players who are asked to contain their enthusiasm for the upcoming blood-bath.

Of the four or five original rep players left, why can they not be distributed around the four house teams. These teams also have players away on vacations or whatever. If this simplistic solution cannot be arranged, how about a select team of some sort, and a few exhibition games, or do these boys have to face a further nine or ten humiliating batterings just to save face for some adults not capable of correcting a previous miscalculation. As you well know, even the local Milton newspapers have recognized a loser and have stopped following the games
