Burlington tourney

Selects just miss finals

Milton atom house league selects put on an excellent performance in three games at the Burlington Invitational tournament Sunday just missing qualifying for the championship by one point.

The atoms played the three games within five hours. The squad dropped its opener 2-1 to Hamilton before playing Burlington to a scoreless

tie and beating Kitchener 2-0.

Against Hamilton, Milton controlled the play throughout the game except for a brief lapse early in the second half when Hamilton scored both its goals. Milton continued to press and nearly tied the score in the latter stages of the game.

Hamilton's first goal was scored on from a

goalmouth scramble. The second goal was scored on a penalty kick after a hand ball.

Milton had taken a 1-0 lead in the first half. Stephen Hart fired home a well-placed pass from Ian Leid. Milton almost came back to tie the score on a good opportunity late in the game when Doug Parks centred a ball from right wing to Eugene Coody whose shot beat the goalie but sailed just inches over the cross-bar.

Chris Green earned a shutout as Milton and Burlington drew 0-0. Strong defensive play by Milton fullbacks Jeff Truswell, Doug Carles

and Scott Ovenden rarely allowed the ball into Milton's end of the field.

Milton's halfbacks took centrestage in the squad's 2-0 win over Kitchener. Neil Garrett, Chris Pontana and Steve McMaster controlled the mid-field area and kept feeding the Milton forwards the ball.

Leid notched the first goal on a fine first-half passing play from right-winger Shawn Clark to Parks to Leid. Garrett made it 2-0 intercepting a pass at his right half position just outside the penalty area and unleashed a powerful drive into the goal. Again, Green earned the shutout.

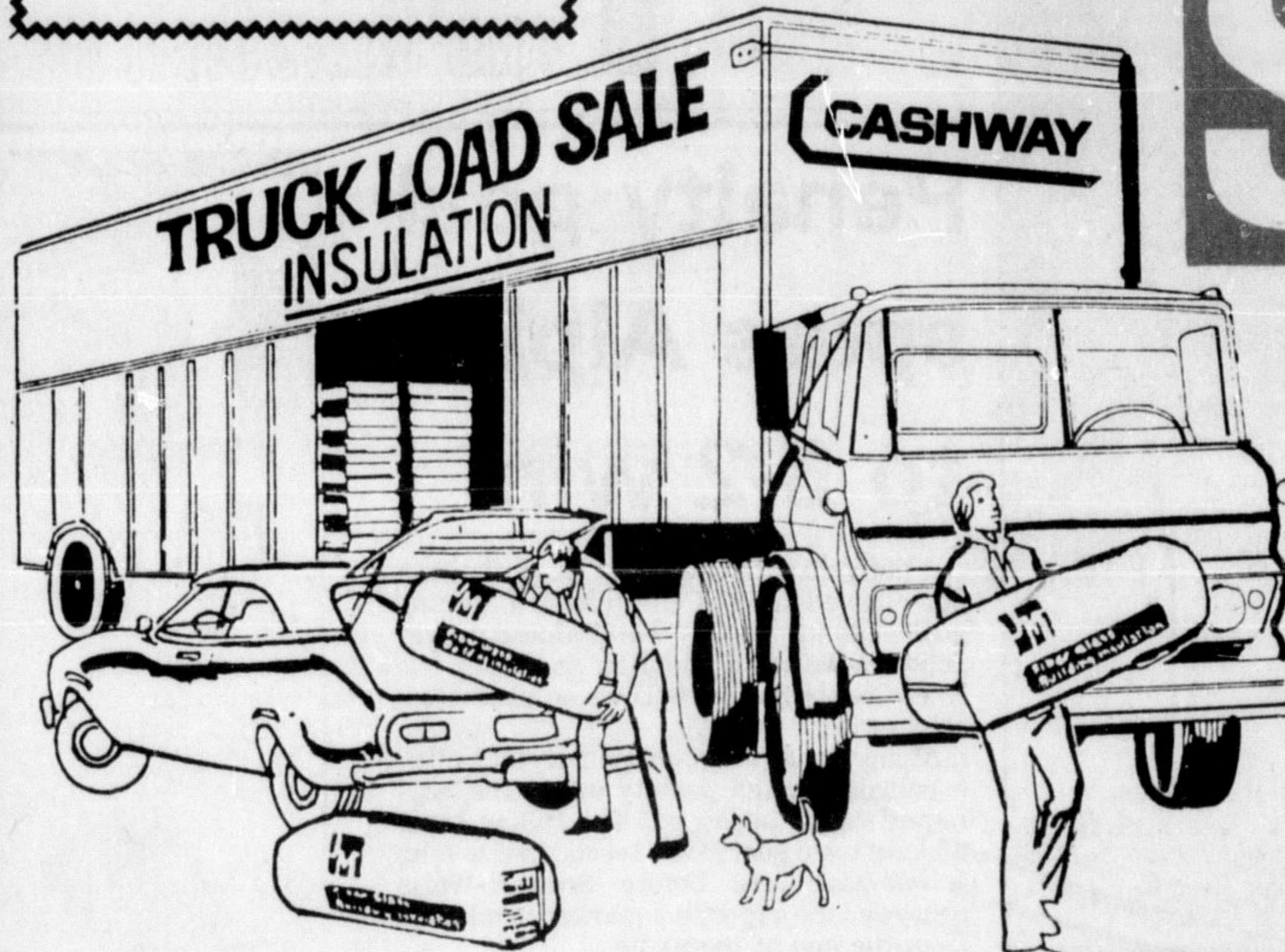

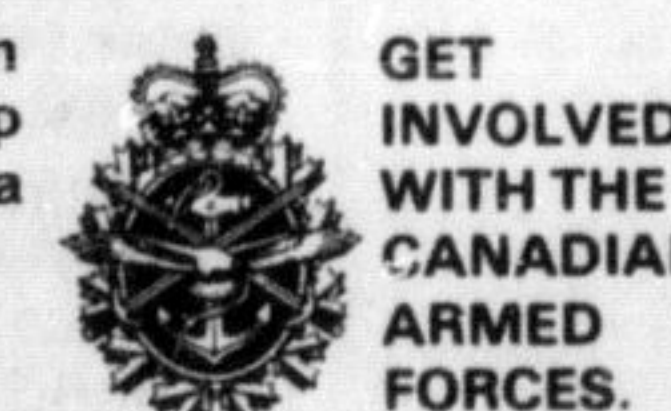
