Fire display at Milton Mall

Preventing fires can be simple, with the proper knowledge. That is the message from Milton Fire Department which is holding its

annual Fire Prevention Week this week. The local department has set up shop in Milton Mall and is busy educating both the public

and shopkeepers on a variety of fire preventing methods. Emphasis is being put on the correct installation and maintenance of woodburning stoves and appliances, said Fire Chief Jim Coulson.

The suggestion has met with enthusiasm and considerable interest from Mall employees, he said, and he plans to take the idea to downtown shop owners and businesses. The general public is invited to drop in to visit fire department employees at their Mall location and take in films on fire prevention from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday to Friday of this week.

Freedom shortlived

Two Maplehurst Correctional Centre residents who escaped from the institution Monday afternoon, enjoyed less than 24 hours of freedom before being captured. At 2 p.m. Tuesday, Metro Toronto police informed Maplehurst the two had been apprehended.

Both men made their flight from freedom from a work gang on Maplehurst grounds outside the fenced confines of the medium-security institution.

The two prisoners are Frederick Harry Neil, 23, of Collingwood and David Robert Tutt, 20, of Newmarket.

Neil was serving a sentence for assault, failing to appear in court and driving while suspended. He was due to be released in January.

Tutt due to be released in April, was serving time for possession of stolen property and impaired driving.

The latest escape brings the toll to 12 men who have escaped from Maplehurst to date.

Allan Roberts, superintendent of Maplehurst said officials are discussing security changes but no firm decisions have been made.

According to the chief, the department answered approximately 20 calls to dwellings last year, where the problem was related to heating equipment and appliances.

He anticipates a similar number of calls this winter. The situation has prompted the department to offer advice on stoves and appliances and also the correct use of fire extinguishers.

Chief Coulson has visited all Mall shops and is inviting staff to join firefighters for a coffee and learn how to use a fire extinguisher.

Landfill hearing up to Minister

Halton is in effect suing Halton, following the decision last Tuesday in a Toronto Division Court to allow the Town of Milton an injunction which may hold up an Environmental Assessment Board hearing slated for Oct. 15.



That meeting, to be held in Halton Centennial Manor, is to delve into a Halton regional application to turn 246 acres (95 hectares) of land at Tremaine and Britannia Rds. into the next regional landfill site. However the Town of Milton has, in its injunction, asked the hearing proceed under the rules of the Environmental Assessment Act (EAA), while the Region has prepared all its evidence, including an engineering study, under the regulations of the Environmental Protection Act (EPA).

The EPA deals only with the impact at and immediately around the proposed dump site. The EAA deals with the total impact, including social and economical, on the entire Region of Halton.

After a day-long session before Mr. Justice James Southey, last Tuesday the decision made at 5:30 p.m. was to defer the question of which act the hearing will proceed under directly to Environment Minister or Harry Parrott for the final decision.

Mr. Justice Southey noted the injunction sought by Milton would require going through pounds of documentation. Fred Leitch, the lawyer representing Milton, argued the dump is not exempted under EAA legislation because it has not yet been approved.

A former director of the Acton Fall Fair, Jack Fryer died suddenly at Toronto General Hospital, September 11. He was in his 64th year.

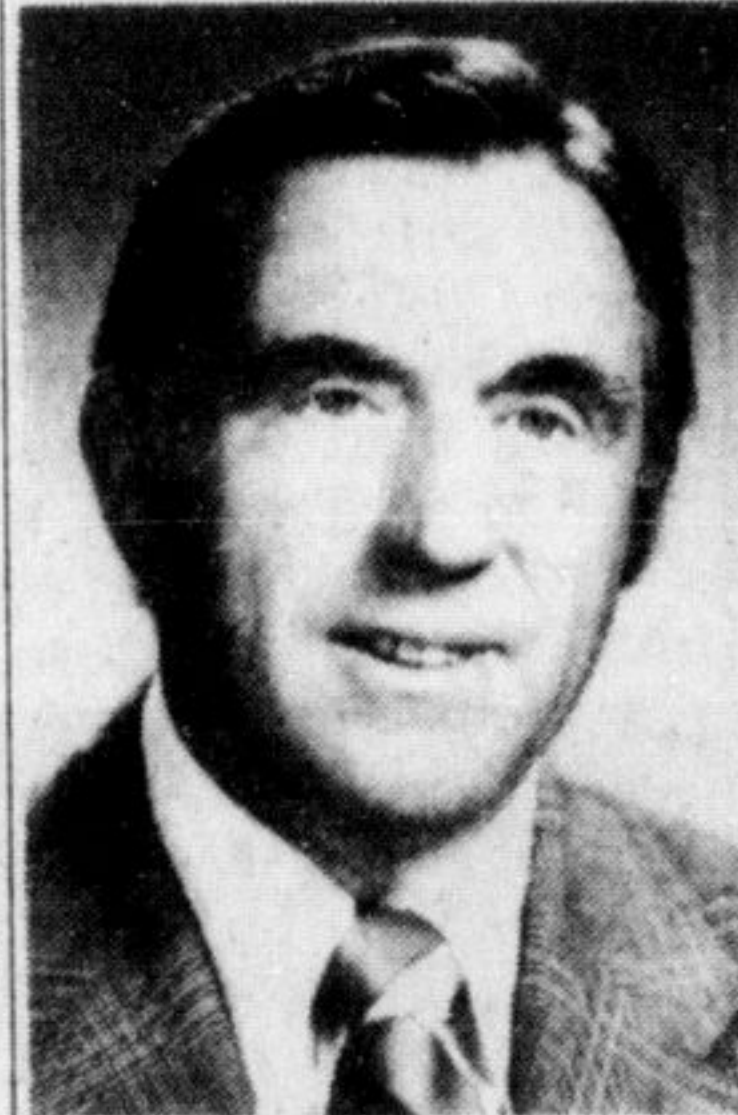
A well known organizer of the fall fair for many years, Mr. Fryer was farming at R.R. 4 Acton until his death.
