## Inflation main concern Jelinek finds in survey

Inflation is the number one issue in Canada today, according to a survey recently undertaken by Halton MP Otto Jelinek.

The questionnaire circulated to Halton households last summer indicated that 47.1 per cent of the respondents feel inflation is the most important issue today, followed by energy (14.3 per cent), national unity (12.1 per cent), unemployment (9 per cent), law and order (8.1 per cent), constitution (3.5 per cent), interest rates (1.2 per cent) and bilingualism (0.2 per cent). Other issues listed included government spending,

environmental protection, and immigration.

Results from the questionnaire show that 83.1 per cent of the people surveyed believe the constitution should be brought to Canada. However, 61.8 per cent responded that it should not be amended unilaterally by the federal government. A total of 75.4 per cent said it should be amended with the provinces.

A majority of the people surveyed (57.3 per cent) said they were not in favor of the present distribution of federal and provincial powers. According to the sur-

vey, 55.9 per cent of the respondents felt that the Liberal government should re-introduce the Progressive Conservative mortgage and property tax credit program.
