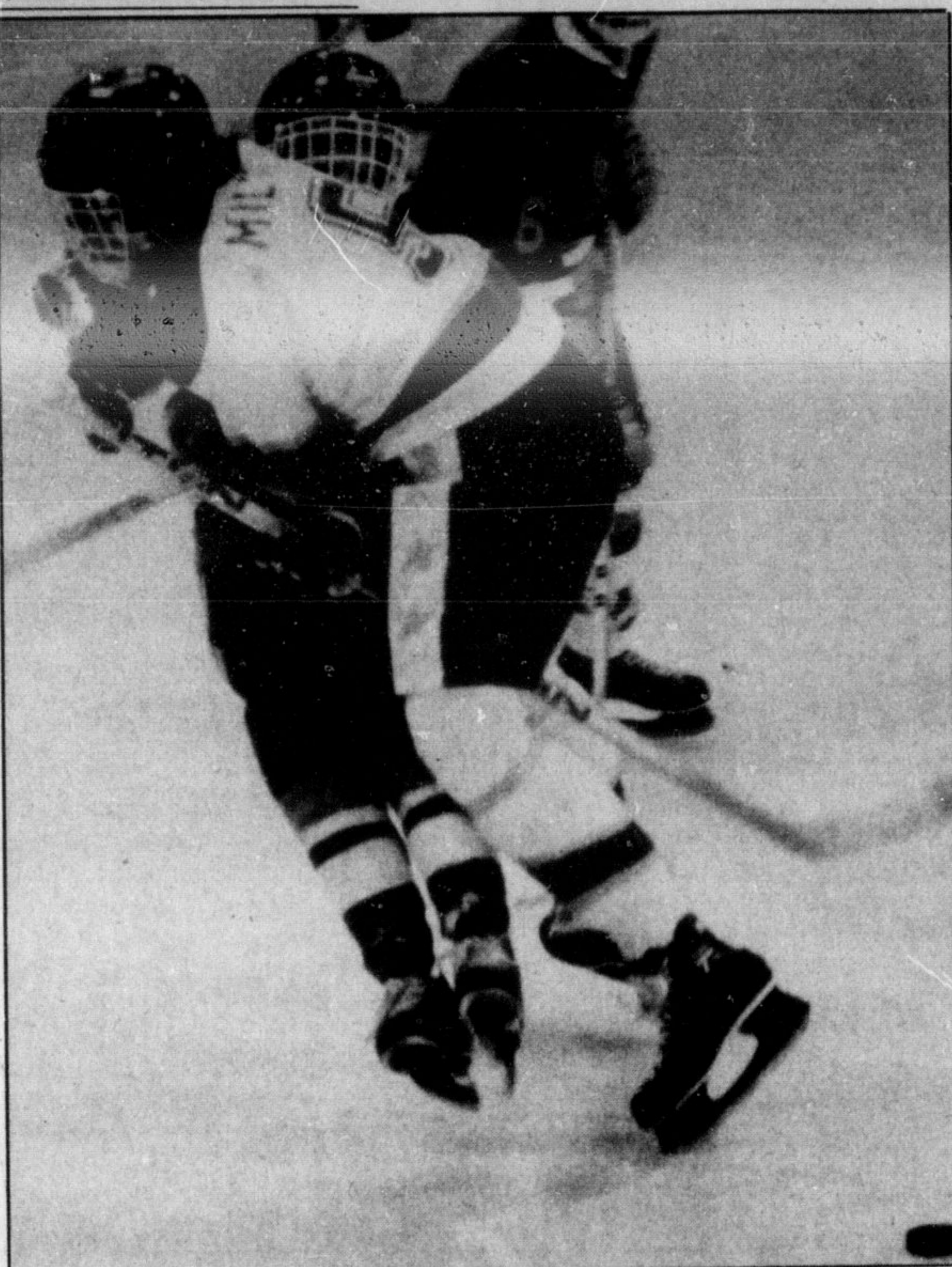

Rep coaches face uphill battle

Last week, The Champion looked at eight rep hockey coaches and the challenges they face. This week, we'll take a look at the two remaining teams, Fifth Wheel major bantams and Wilson's Auctioneers juveniles.

MAJOR BANTAM

Fifth Wheel
Major Bantam coach Garry Hudson made one of the team's biggest changes last weekend when he let three players go back to selects. Further changes of lines and personnel are also on tap although Fifth Wheeler's so far, 3-1-1, hasn't been the reason.

This team were OMHA champions in A division as major peewees two years ago but floundered as minor bantams last year. Hudson said he was hopeful a switch to a two-line offence would give the squad more reliability.

Hudson echos a feeling several rep coaches have stated this year—many players are content to play select hockey.

"We can't get players on select to come up to play," explained Hudson. "They've made it good for them with two games a week and a few tournaments. They play as many games as we do. Why should they play second-string here when they can be stars in select?"

Hudson said he feels one of his strengths will be on defence. Mike Chudleigh, Greg Morey, Rick Serafini and Graeme Hicken make up the defence. In goal, Hudson has both returnees Norm Knoflach and Andrew Saliba.

At the present time, the forwards are not set in lines. The eight players slotted for the forward position centre around all-purpose centre Mark Haskett. Jeff Harris, Jeff Sanford, Howie Scannell, Jim Clancey, Chris

Cormier, Terry Ellwood and Mike Hennebury make up the forwards. Jack Duimstra (assistant coach), John Bain (manager) and Jerry Brophy (assistant manager) make up the rest of the coaching unit.

The biggest problem facing the juveniles is simply getting enough players to fill the sweaters. A lack of interest of players more than 16 years old coupled with renewed interest in high school hockey which forbids rep players has reduced the juvenile team's numbers to five at one point.

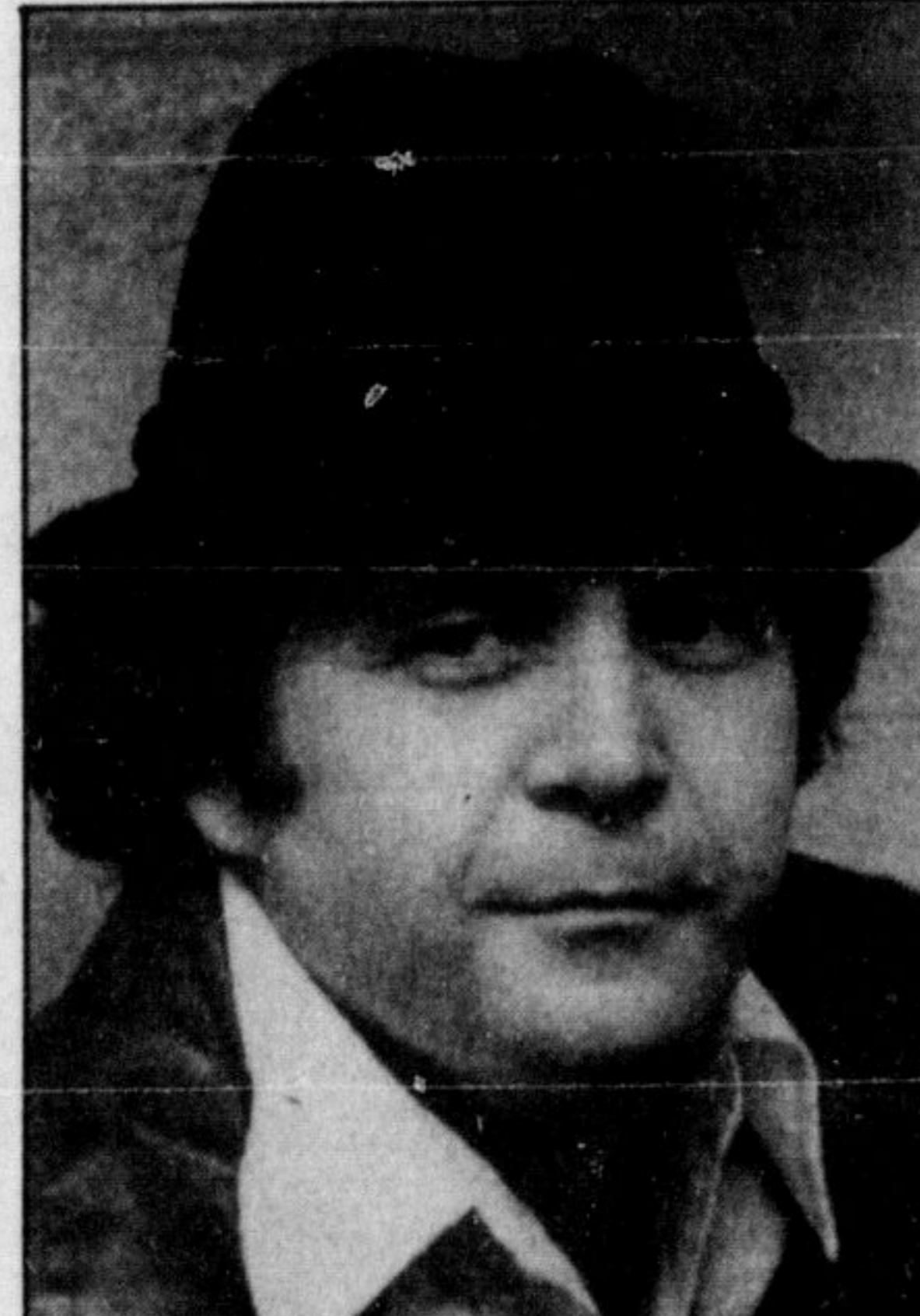
The team's management has since recruited house league players among others to bolster the squad's strength to 11 but if the team is to challenge successfully in the league, more players must come forward.

"We're in rough shape," admits juvenile coach Ron Dunsmore. "We can't get players out to games. As a result we're about a month behind the rest of the teams. We didn't have set lines until the fifth game because we didn't have any players."

Dunsmore will handle the team along with assistant coach Ron Ryckman and manager Stan Price. Dunsmore previously coached house league hockey in Milton and bantam A hockey in Oakville.

"I guess I took this job for the challenge," adds Dunsmore. "It gets away from the babysitting of the house league. But I didn't think it would be this much of a challenge."

"It took us about two weeks to get the respect of the players. 'The players were testing us up to then, I guess, to

With a busy schedule and the Jr. B Flyers taking the best players the juveniles can find, Dunsmore & Co. will have an uphill battle throughout most of the year.

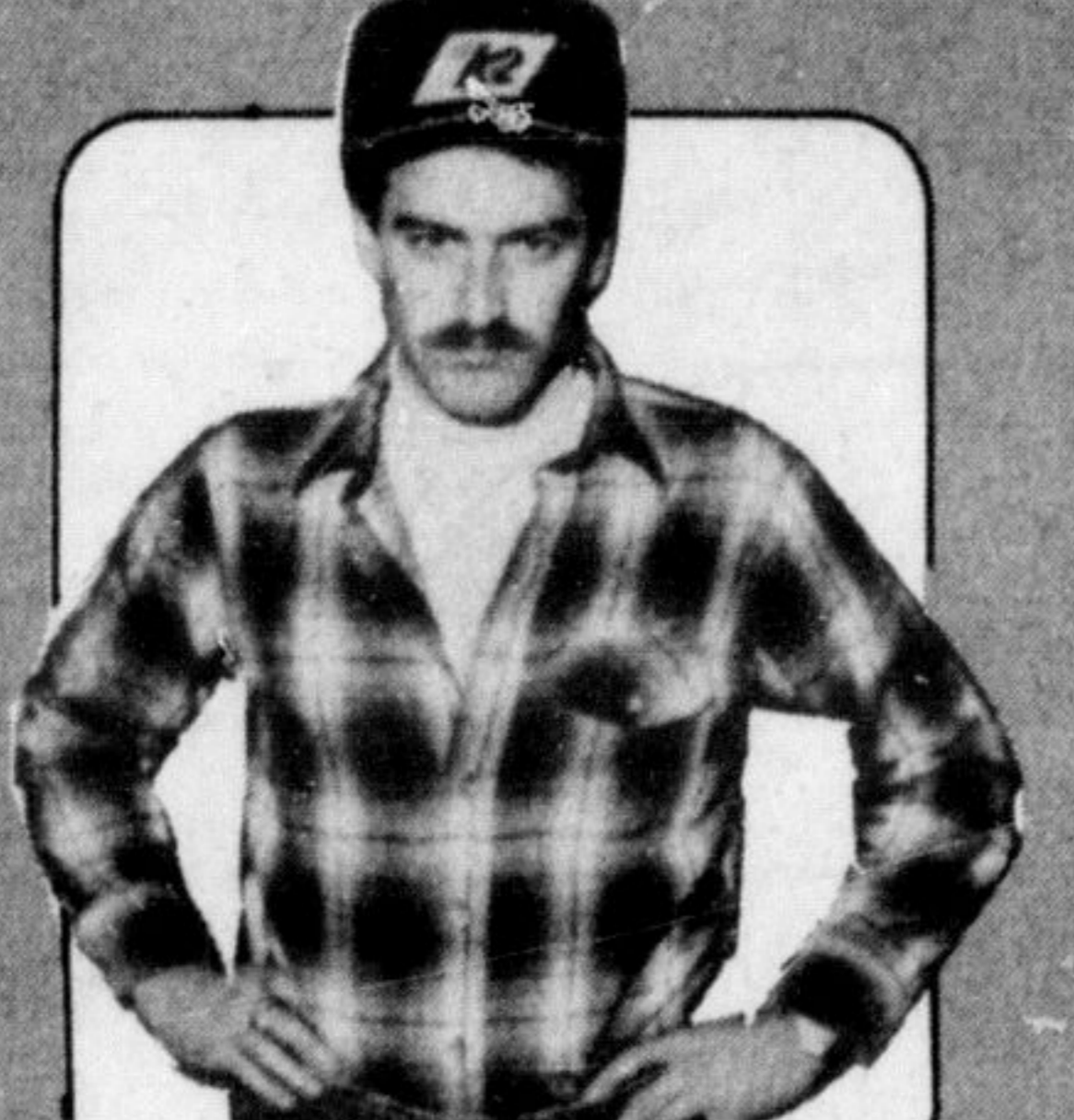

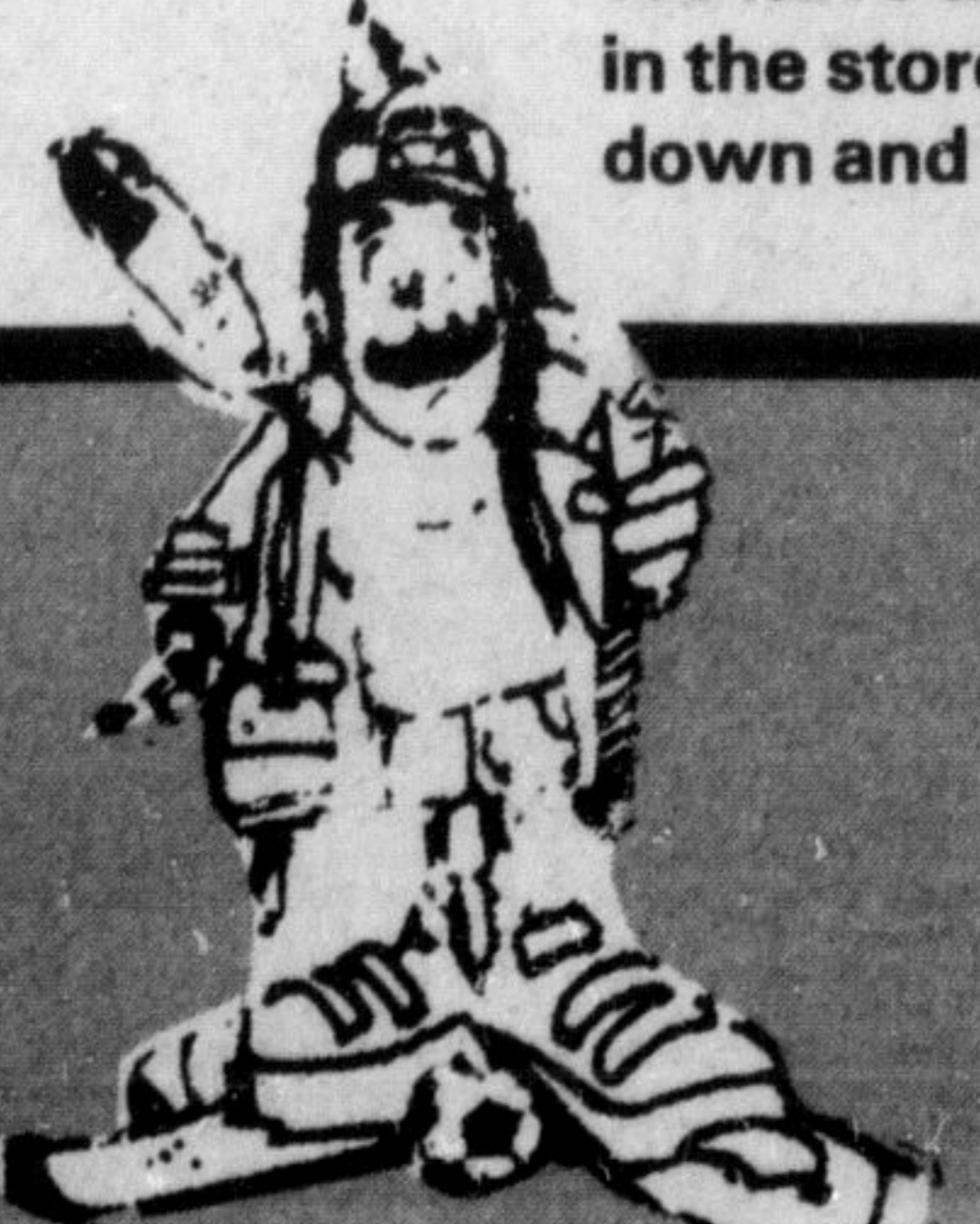
