## Birthright opens office

Birthright, a volunteer organization offering a viable alternative to abortion for distressed pregnant women, has opened an office in Oakville to serve the needs of Halton Region.  
The local office of this international agency is located at 2315 Lakeshore Rd. W., Suite 204, Bronte. The office will train volunteers to provide counselling, a pregnancy tests, and a distress line at 825-1216.  
Maureen Murray, who spearheaded Birthright services in this area, feels the office should be in full operation sometime in November.  
She and Judy Pangman are the only two trained Birthright volunteers in Oakville. Mrs. Murray has been involved since 1972, when she lived in Kitchener. In 1977, she moved to Oakville and began working for the Mississauga office. Mrs. Pangman joined Birthright in response to a newspaper article in October, 1978.  
Halton has been served by the Mississauga Birthright office for eight years, and because of increased demand for help, it can no longer adequately serve the needs of Halton.

stressed, and receives no government funding. "We rely on private donations and service clubs." In Halton, the board of directors consists of a minister, priest, two doctors, lawyer, chartered accountant and Mrs. Murray.  
Director of the local office, Mrs. Murray feels there have been about 500 abortions performed in Oakville and Burlington in 1979. Birthright, rather than suggesting an abortion, counsels young pregnant women to have their baby, and many clients are sent to homes for unwed mothers in either Toronto or Hamilton. Mrs. Pangman is treasurer and volunteer co-ordinator.  
"A young pregnant girl is sent to a home, where she receives counselling and is able to continue her education, and have the baby," said Murray.  
Birthright has more than 400 offices in the United States, about 60 across Canada, and also operates in Australia, England, Jamaica, South Africa and other countries. The organization was founded in Toronto by Louise Summerhill in 1968, and she continues to serve as its founding executive director.

however, offers a direct service to distressed pregnant women, be it baby needs, medical attention, information on maternity homes, jobs, shelter and legal aid.

The two women will hold their first training session, and open meeting, for Birthright volunteers, at the new office on October 22 at 8 p.m. Though Murray and Pangman are the only two trained volunteers, there are a number of others who have been collecting baby clothes, maternity wear, bedding and cribs for Birthright.  
The organization is looking for approximately 50 volunteers in Halton, to not only answer the telephone, give pregnancy tests and counselling, but also for publicity and driving.  
"We hope to have three shifts in the office per day," said Murray, adding volunteers will be asked to give a minimum commitment of two hours every other week.

### NAMES NOT ON POLLING LIST

Any person who has qualified to have his name entered on the polling list during the period of enumeration (September 2nd, 1980 to September 20th, 1980) and finds that his name is not entered thereon or who has not filled the necessary forms to have his name entered during the period for corrections to the list (ending October 22nd, 1980) can attend at my office to secure a certificate which will allow his name to be entered at the polling station. In addition to this, qualified electors may be entitled to have their name added to the list at the polling station on polling day.  
Qualified Elector means a person who during the period of September 2nd, 1980 to September 30th, 1980 was a Canadian Citizen or other British Subject, a resident of Milton or a non-resident owner or tenant or a spouse thereof and has attained the age of 18 years by November 10th, 1980.

### PROXY VOTING

Forms are available at my office for the appointment of a voting proxy. A certificate to vote by proxy must be certified by THE CLERK. This can only be done between October 21st, 1980 to 5:00 p.m. on Polling Day, November 10th, 1980.
