Conference on pre-schoolers

If you want to learn more about your pre-school child, his interests, and his family, come to the fifth annual Shoreline Conference Nov. 8 at Sheridan College in Oakville.

Over 400 people are expected to attend the daylong conference this year, sponsored by the co-op preschool organization that helps over 1,500 families in Halton and Peel through a system of voluntary labor and professional skills. The conference offers a wide variety of workshops, including Things That Go Bump In The Night, about pre-school fears, and Co-op Games Every Child Can Win.

"There's lots of dads this year, and five Carmelite nuns who run a day care nursery in Toronto," says Susan Merko, a former chairman of the conference.

The conference begins at 8:15 a.m. with registration and coffee, and this is followed by guest speaker Stan Shapiro, consultant to the Alfred Adler Institute of Ontario.

Two-hour seminars in the morning are followed by a cold buffet lunch, another two-hour workshop in the afternoon and refreshments at 4:30.

Conference fees vary from \$12 for students to \$25 for families for a full day with lunch.

Workshops besides the two already mentioned include:

- music, mime and movement, teaching the use of the body as an expressive unit.
- experiments about us, delving into experiments children may practise how senses, reactions and reflexes function.
- self-esteem, your's and your child's, about a more effective individual child rearing program.
- enriching children's lives with books, demonstrating how the right books can help to expand your child's concept of reality, and relation to the environment.
- toys for kids, an examination of the safety, educational value, durability and suitability of toys for children 1-8 years.
- importance of play to growth and learning
- fathers role as a parent.

The Shoreline non-profit Corporation includes among its co-op nurseries: St. Suthbert's, St. Aidan's, Kiddy Korner, Charnwood, Bronte, St. Hilda's, Hopedale, St. Simon and Les Cocinelles (Ladybugs)—all from Oakville.
