Mrs. Gooding, in a report on "Gaps in the Delivery of Health and Social Services" said "no treatment is now being provided" in terms of a public health dental pro-

She noted the Region will have to "catch up" to be within recent provincial guidelines.

A school prevention program would have to reach into higher grades, at least up to Grade 10. "There is a need to pro-

vide dental programs for infants, a senior citizen preventive clinic, and a central clinic for marginal income people of all ages," she said.

Mrs. Gooding has urged the Health and Social Services Committee to send her report to staff so methodology on correcting gaps can be brought to committee as soon as possible for discussion.






