Got itchy feet lately? With fishing nearly over and some hunting trips over, are your kids starting to bug you to take them some place for an hour or two?

For you outdoorsmen with a couple of healthy kids who are not looking forward to Dad spending Saturday and Sunday afternoons watching football, hockey, etc., here is an easy solution to your problem which is neither expensive nor too time consuming.

Take them to Kortwright Park, which features many types of waterfowl. There are 40 species of waterfowl native to North America and many more imported from Australia, Africa, the Caribbean, and South America. It has a lovely setting and is just on the outskirts of Guelph, off Kortwright Road.

Our own wildlife centre at Mountsberg has just about everything which would appeal to young and old alike. Take long walks through the bush on well-marked trails. Watch the waterfowl as they come and go all day long. It has many special features all year long which are well advertised.

If you want to travel a little farther on the weekend, there is a beautiful buffalo ranch near Barrie. It's on Oro Concession road 8, north of Barrie. When you arrive, you are taken around the ranch on a mini-bus.

Besides buffalo, they have several magnificent elk on the ranch as well as a few deer.

One of the disturbing things about the eruption of Mt. St. Helens, aside from the loss of human lives and property, is the tremendous loss of wildlife.

The Washington State Department of Game estimated the first blast which blew a cubic mile of earth off the top of the mountain killed 5,250 Roosevelt elk, 6,000 black-tailed deer, 200 black bears, 100 mountain goats, 15 mountain lions (now nearly extinct), 441,000 salmon, steelhead and trout and 1.5 million birds and small mammals.

Such is the force of mother nature.
