Our own wildlife centre at Mountsberg has just about everything which would appeal to young and old alike. Take long walks through the bush on well-marked trails. Watch the waterfowl as they come and go all day long. It has many special features all year long which are well advertised.

If you want to travel a little farther on the weekend, there is a beautiful buffalo ranch near Barrie. It's on Oro Concession raod 8, north of Barrie. When you arrive, you are taken around the ranch on a mini-bus.

Besides buffalo, they have several magnificent elk on the ranch as well as a few deer.

One of the disturbing things about the eruption of Mt. St. Helens, aside from the loss of human lives and property, is the tremendous loss of wildlife.

The Washington State Department of Game estimated the first blast which blew a cubic mile of earth off the top of the mountain killed 5,250 Roosevelt elk, 6,000 black-tailed deer, 200 black bears, 100 mountain goats, 15 mountain lions (now nearly extinct), 441,000 salmon, steelhead and trout and 1.5 million birds and small mammals.

Such is the force of mother nature.
