

# Recipes



## Pork pot pie

Don't bore yourself with leftovers by serving a meal the same way twice. Use leftover meat combined with vegetables, held together with a creamy sauce and top it with pastry or biscuits. Keep leftover meat covered and refrigerated and use it within two or three days for the best flavour. Only 6 ounces of meat cubes are needed to make one cup, enough for two when used in this combination dish. Planning meals ahead of time saves money so shop with this in mind. Buy your next roast slightly larger than usual so the leftover meat can be transformed into a new dish. A pot pie is a great way to use what isn't consumed the first night.

- 1 tablespoon butter or drippings
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 stalk celery, chopped
- 3 cups cubed pork
- 1 can (10 oz.) condensed soup
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 cup cooked carrot slices
- 1 cup cooked green beans OR peas

**Potato Biscuits:**  
 1 1/2 cups all purpose flour  
 1 tablespoon baking powder  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 1/4 cup butter  
 3/4 cup mashed potatoes  
 1/2 cup milk

Heat butter in ovenproof frypan. Sauté onion, celery and pork about 5 minutes until vegetables are tender. Stir in soup, water, carrots and green beans; bring to boil and hold a simmer while preparing biscuits. Top with biscuits. (Or transfer meat mixture to ovenproof casserole and top with biscuits.) Bake in 400 degree F oven 15 to 18 minutes until biscuits are lightly browned.

**Potato Biscuits:**  
 Mix flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in butter with pastry blender or two forks. Stir in potatoes. Add milk; mix quickly to form a soft dough. Turn out onto a floured surface. Knead gently about 10 times. Press or roll out 1/2 inch thick. Cut into wedges. Place on hot pork mixture. Makes 6 servings.
