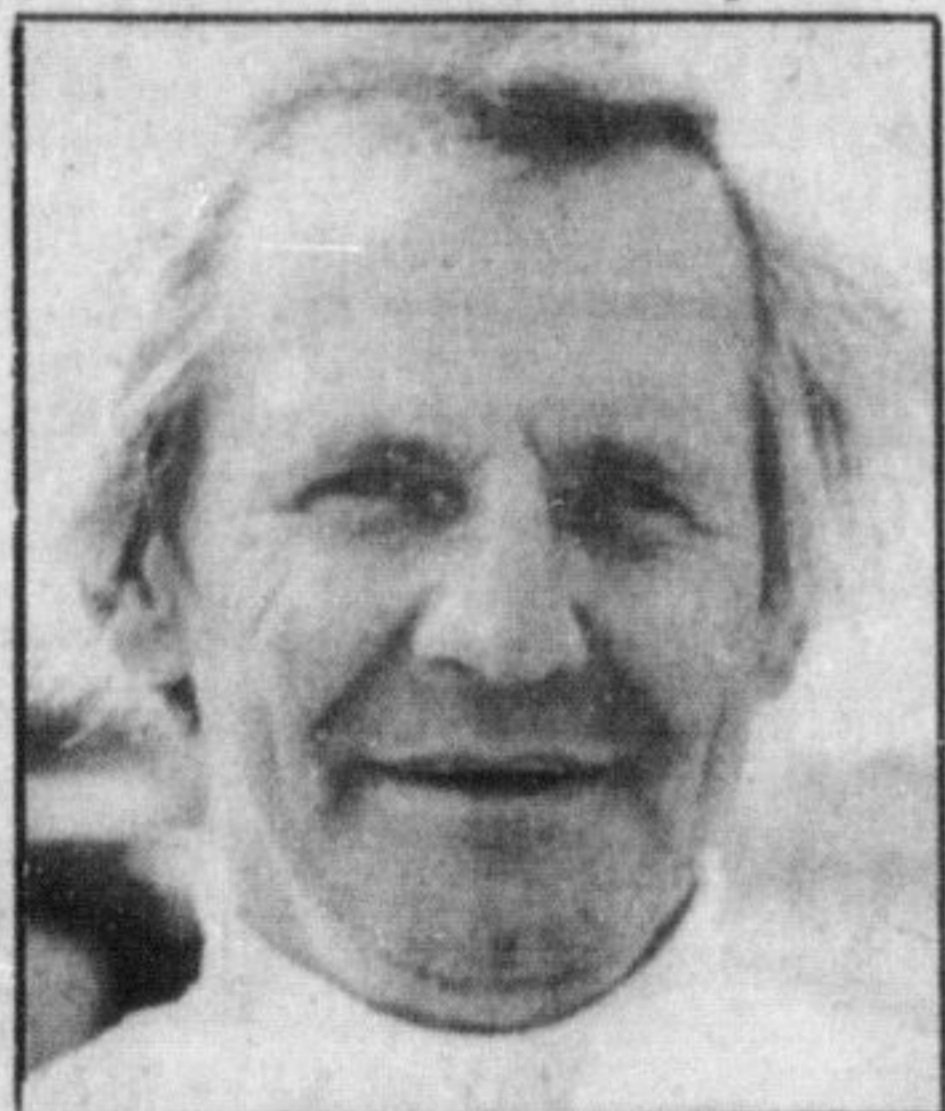
bounced back with a flurry. The deciding game in the semi-final will be played at 7 p.m. Sunday at Milton Sports Centre.

Midgets avenged

Milton midget selects gained a strong measure of revenge with a 5-2 victory over Georgetown in the opening game of a tournament in Strathroy during the March Break.

In Milton's second game of the tourney, the squad was edged 2-1 by Petrolia in a game in which Milton didn't take a penalty.

In the Georgetown game, Milton scored five unanswered goals in the last half of the game to offset a 2-0 Georgetown lead and take the win.

Georgetown opened the scoring early in the first period and coasted along upping the lead to two goals at the midway point of the second period.

The brilliant play of Milton goaltender Todd Harvey and a superb defensive effort by Gerry

Noseworthy, Giles Vanderholt and Brent Myers held Milton in the game and kept the score low.

Just 19 seconds after Georgetown's second goal, Scott Rouleau capped a beautiful play with Mark Newby and Scott Morey by putting the puck into the goal to bring Milton back to within a goal.

The third period belonged to Milton. With 36 seconds gone, captain Steve Duguay tied the score on a set up from Mike Rieter (who was voted Milton's most improved player of the year).

Less than two minutes later, Vanderholt sent a slapshot blast from the blue line into the goal which completely handcuffed the Georgetown

goalie. Assists went to Kevin Foley and Newby. David Nole, who has played brilliantly toward the end of the season, put Milton up by two with a slapshot along the ice. Myers assisted.

With Georgetown pressing to get back into the game, Harvey blanked them the rest of the way.

With two minutes remaining, Reiter sewed up the win catching the corner of the goal. Duguay and Vanderholt assisted on the play.

It was a satisfying win for Milton which lost to Georgetown in the championship game of the Four-Town tournament last month in Orangeville in a tie game. The first-shot rule was used to determine a winner.

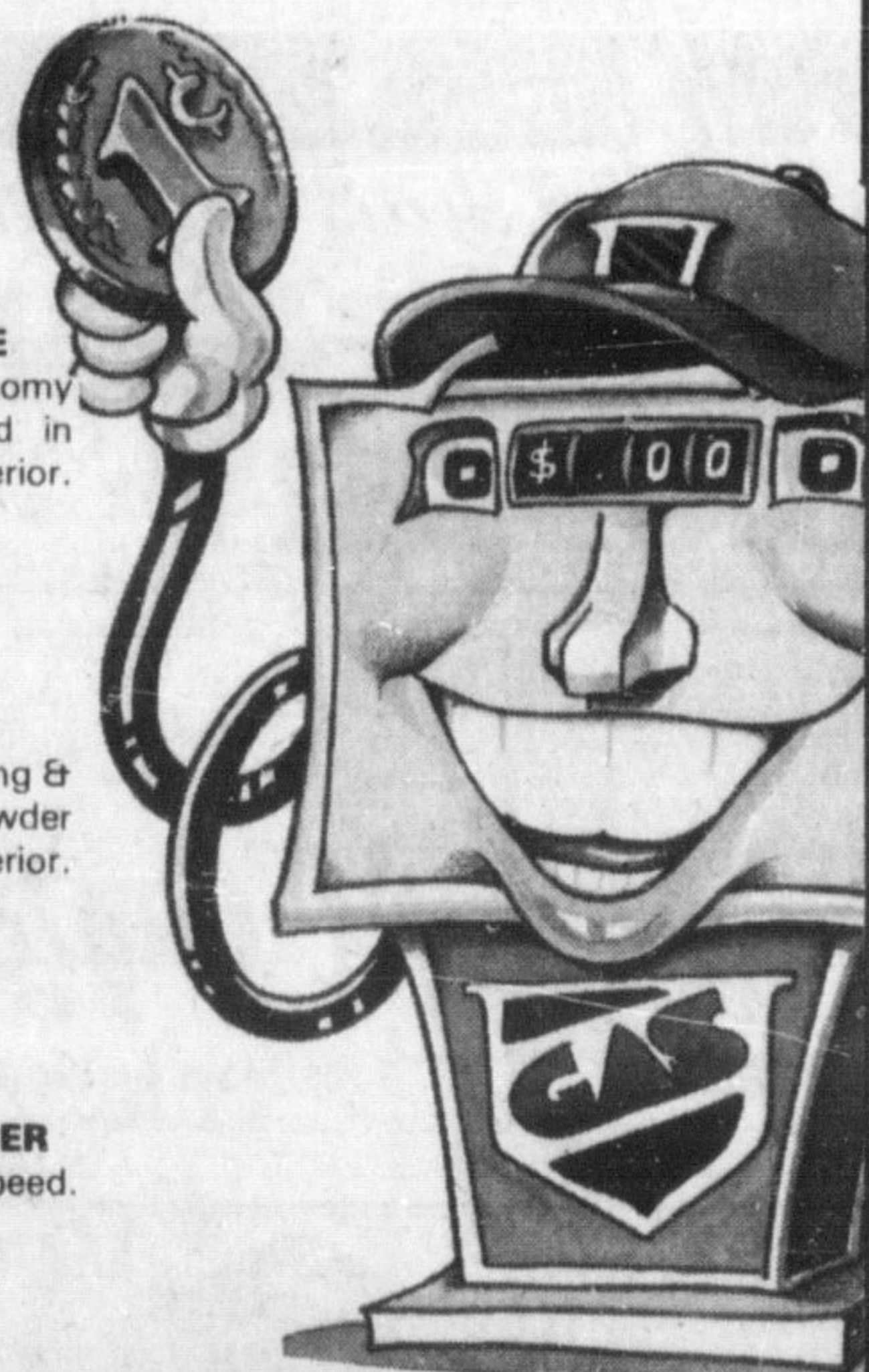
