HRCA getting \$35,632 grant

Natural Resources Minister James Auld has announced that the Halton Region Conservation Authority will receive a \$35,632 provincial grant to continue development of four conservation areas in 1981. The proposed development will include general landscaping, roads, parking area and nature trail improvements, development of backyard habitat and waterfowl exhibits, construction of boat docking facilities, boardwalks, retaining wall, lookout blind, tree planting, wildlife habitat improvement, provision of picnic tables, signs and other general conservation area improvements. The development will be undertaken at Kelso, Hilton Falls, Mountsberg and Rattlesnake Point Conservation Areas. Total estimated cost is \$71,264.

Centre needs volunteers to help handle big response

The response to three morning programs for mothers offered at the newly opened Centre has been overwhelming; so organizers are calling for more volunteer reinforcements. There are now about 16 volunteers offering their time Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings but Carol Holmes, Program Consultant said she would like to see that number doubled. "We are at the stage where we basically need help with the children," she said. During the Programs for mothers called Life Skills, Parenting and Mothers' Break their children are cared for by trained staff as well as volunteers. "We need seniors to

rock babies, and we will welcome mothers with children of their own who want to help out," suggests Carol Holmes. Judging by initial program support, Carol said Milton has an obvious need for such a centre. A contact centre run by volunteers has been established at The Centre on Main St. This program is run through the use of the telephone and offers pub-

lic information. Calls regarding housing, babysitting and other services have been received at the Centre and volunteers will find the answers. "The adolescent program should be off the

ground in a couple of weeks," said Carol. "We are seriously looking into a group of young people age 16 to 18 who have presented the idea of doing volunteer work with children on weekends," she added.

The weekend program which would serve children from age 6 to 12 will be similar to a Youth Assisting Youth program which is going on in Toronto. The adolescent program will be run through

the week under the supervision of Centre staff which is in the process of being hired. Those interested in volunteering for child care at the centre can call Carol Holmes at 876-1244.
