Smelt and suckers best right now

YOU STILL HAVE time to get yourself a good supply of cheap meat for the freezer.

Suckers and smelt are at their best right now and for those who cannot afford a long trip to catch fish for your fish-hungry family, a trip to the Indian Creek, on Appleby Line or the park at Lowville will get you a good supply.

Smelt are a little harder to get so you should go with an experienced fisherman. A few dollars spent on a good smelt net will pay you good dividends and with proper care, will last for years.

Last weekend, hundreds of people (and some with small sons, we hope) spent their time at their favorite stream or lake as the trout season opened for another season.

Remember fellows, we do not want to see a scene in which a young lad of 23 was shot for trespassing. That was a horrifying experience for all concerned and the less said about it, the better.

Worms are up and now is the time to get an ample supply for the summer, when dry weather sets in and you are faced with paying from 75 cents to \$1.50 a dozen for worms. Rainbow trout also love live minnows and there is an ample supply in the small streams of Halton. Start out with a light step and a sharp hook.

I just received a news release from the Ministry of Natural Resources. It seems the moose management plan produced results. A selective harvesting of moose, such as a certain number of bulls, cows and calves could also be introduced by the ministry, if necessary.

Last year's moose-hunting laws saved about 3,500 moose in the 1980 season. Now, those 3,500 moose produce offspring which would have been lost to the moose herd and the ever-increasing number of moose hunters in Ontario alone.

Necessary predator control and habitat management are two options under consideration by the biologists. Moose managers hoped their restrictive measures would reduce the 1980 moose kill of hunters by one-sixth.

The weather gave a helping hand this year and reduced the year's kill by one-third. Hang in there you moose hunters. We are sure you will not have trouble getting your moose as often as you used to.

In the did-you-know department, the tallest known tree in the province of Ontario is a white pine. Close to Algonquin Park, the tree soars to 148 feet.

Also, did you know the most poisonous mushroom in the world, the destroying angel, grows abundantly in the aspen-birch forests of northern Ontario during the fall.

Tennis facility suffers setback construction slated for phases

Financial difficulties have thrown a knot into plans by the Milton Tennis Club to build its \$500,000 facility on time.

At a meeting of the club's members and many interested non-members Thursday at E.C. Drury, it was revealed the cost of the total project had increased considerably.

In addition, lifetime memberships which were expected to be gone by this time, had reached just 124 founding members. About 150 people attended the meeting.

The combination of the two factors has left the club considering a two-phase construction program.

The meeting was called to enable the membership to hear the proposals from the club executive.

It was also the first chance the club had to find out what the members wanted and felt about the club.

The first stage in the two-phase proposal would see the construction of three outdoor tennis courts, fencing, lighting and the parking lot finished by August 1.

The rest of the complex, excluding the swimming pool, would be completed by September 1982.

Funding became a problem. A total of \$146,000 exists in the building fund. Although the relatively small amount of money was blamed on the public's reluctance to invest in an unbuilt project, it was felt members

would come out of the woodwork once the complex got underway.

Funds from the anticipated membership would be sufficient to finance the rest of the project.

The club is looking at Wintario for possible funds. Several executive members will be meeting with officials from the provincial lottery corporation Monday May 11 and present an application form at that time.

While the mood of the meeting was somewhat hesitant and confused, one member's comments seem to sum up the mood of the members.

"I think the whole deal is a tremendous idea for the town," said Bob McTavish. "I've got five kids and I want them all to play tennis."

"The only concern I have is that we might get into a short-term bind. Then who will fund the deficit? Maybe we should be paying more."

Several ideas concerning funding the deficit surfaced at the meeting.

One person suggested each member chip in more money which would be returned when the membership rolls swell.

The club executive decided to raise the lifetime membership rate for a family from \$1,000 to \$1,250 on June 1. That would be further increased by \$250 on Jan. 1, 1982.

The club also decided to hold another open general meeting during the first week of June to fill in the club with further developments.

Tenders for construction will be made up and put up for bids within the next two weeks for construction of that initial stage of the project.

In related news, the club was incorporated as a non-profit corporation last week. Its non-profit status permitted the club to obtain a favorable lease at the Drury School site (\$1,000 per year) and also means the club pays no taxes.

Educators make consultants equal

That's the effect of Halton Board of Education's chucking of a policy which originally appointed a person for a specific job.

Over the years the same people came to hold the same appointments. This year seven of the eight consultants hired by the board were old faces.

"Most appointments are being renewed as a matter of course," Burlington trustee Bill Priestner commented in reference to his motion.
