## Three members give flower, garden talks

A gardening panel was the highlight of the April meeting of the Milton and District Horticultural Society on Monday evening, April 20.

Len McNeil, past president of the society, introduced the three panelists and their areas of particular expertise. Wilma Muselius, Burke McNeill, and George Clements gave brief summaries of their topics to the audience before splitting up to lead separate workshops.

When the groups reassembled, Mr. McNeil conducted a question period that included both serious and not-so-serious questions—such as how to keep Sweet William out of Brown-Eyed Susan's bed.

Mrs. Muselius covered the large topic of flowers during her introduction and workshop. She gave an excellent summary of planning the flower garden, recognizing different site conditions and seasons of bloom, and illustrated the discussion with annuals, perennials, herbs, and ferns from her garden.

Mr. Clements drew on his years of experience in successful rose growing to lead a workshop on this popular topic. He dealt with pruning, fertilizing, planting, winter protection, and disease control of roses. With nursery catalogues for illustration, he recommended superior rose varieties for every preference, including fragrance.

Pruning and lawn care were two important gardening activities covered by Burke McNeill. He brought along potted evergreens, deciduous shrubs and a young fruit tree to demonstrate correct pruning.
