Straight Line on track

Climaxing an exciting end to an entertaining hockey game, Harry Rowland's second slapshot eluded the pads of The Racer's Edge goalie Dave Ballard with just five seconds left in the game to lead Straight Line to a 3-2 win over The Edge in Milton Industrial Hockey League play Sunday at Milton Sports Centre.

It was just the second loss of the year for The Edge and, in both instances, the winning goal was scored in the final minute.

In other games, John Burns Stable held out to second place with a 2-0 shutout of Lou's Place Hawks while Milton Chrysler-Dodge blanked Milton Realty Majors 4-0.

After Larry Scott put The Edge ahead with a power-play goal three minutes into the final frame, Straight Line couldn't get out of their own zone and only some superlative goalkeeping on the part of netminder Craig Jubb kept his teammates in the contest.

Midway through the period, Rowland was assessed a minor for elbowing and then aggravated his own cause by arguing and was sentenced to an additional two minutes for unsportsmanlike conduct.

Strong penalty-killing efforts by Straight Line coupled with several great saves by Jubb, including a stop off a breakaway from Eric Ellison, kept fencers in the game as they killed off the four minutes in penalties.

Straight Line marched back. With just 1:47 left, Len Smith picked up a rebound after Randy Murray had been set up perfectly in front. Ballard stoPPed Murray but the puck bounced over to Smith who drove it home.

The game took a turn with just 23

seconds left when The Edge's Brent Murray took a run at a Straight Line defender deep in the Straight Line end. Murray argued the call and was assessed a 10-minute misconduct and a game misconduct.

Brother Richard Murray then argued the call and was assessed a 10-minute misconduct and a game misconduct with an accompanying two-minute minor.

The end result left The Edge two players short-handed over the last 23 seconds. Straight Line's Ralph Serafini carried the puck out of the defensive zone and he relayed a pass to Rowland.

The left-winger carried the puck over the blue line and let go with a slapshot which Ballard stopped. The rebound came back to Rowland and he scored with a hard drive for the winning goal.

At the end of the game, The Edge's coach Johnny Penson struck up a loud conversation with the officiating crew and was handed a 10-minute misconduct and a game misconduct which will keep him out of next week's key game against John Burns Stable.

Ellison also scored for The Edge and was denied a second goal which would have put his team ahead 2-0 when a goal was whistled down through an offside call.

Ian Wanless added a single for Straight Line.

The opening game featured excellent goalkeeping by Phil Bailey of Burns Stable and Hap Perrot of Lou's Place. In the end it was Bailey and John Burns which prevailed as the lanky netminder registered his second shutout in succession.

The end of the game was climaxed by a man advantage Lou's Place enjoyed

through a penalty. When Perrot was pulled for the extra man, Lou's Place applied tremendous pressure before Derek Griffiths relieved the pressure with an empty-net goal 18 seconds from the end.

Buddy Thomas provided the difference in the game when he scored midway through the first period. Joy Norland assisted.

In the middle game, Pat Haggart connected for three goals as the steadily improving Milton Chrysler-Dodge continued its climb up the ladder with the 4-0 win over Milton Realty Majors.

Brad Evans earned the shutout between the pipes for Chrysler and was tested in a two-minute span late in the game when MCD was assessed two minor penalties at the same time.

Jim Early added a single tally while Peter Rota and Roger Delnin chipped in with two assists apiece. The victory put Chrysler into a tie with Lou's Place for fourth place in the league.

Notes: The league executive vetoed a trade which would have sent former Firefighter player and present Straight Line coach Al Jones to The Racer's Edge. The deal was worked out but later stopped when it was determined the league's bylaws wouldn't have allowed the conditions. Players can only be traded if they are presently on a team's active list. Jones is currently on the voluntary retired list of John Burns Stable.

The league also decided against any forms of trials with Milton Realty Aerost of the Intermediate B League. The general consensus of all teams was against the motion.

Blades on rampage explode for win over weak Dundas

Steve Scannell and Bruce Cameron each tallied twice with Cameron making it a five-point game with three assists. Don Vandenheuvel, Mike Del Papa and Chris Wakley added to the total with single goals.

Tom Hill handled the goalkeeping chores for Blades but had little action as the weak Dundas entry could muster but few shots in the game.

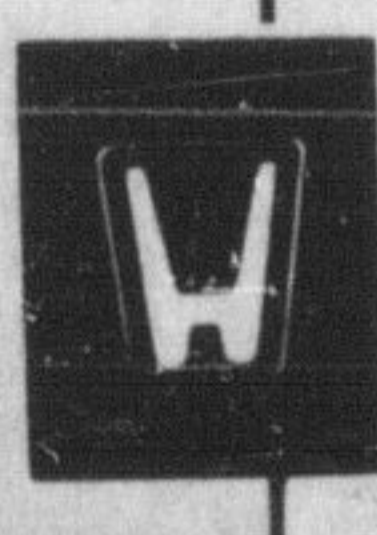
