# T-Birds leave Dundas in a heap

Although Milton Trafalgar Ford major peewees had to battle a blizzard, it was Dundas which was left in a heap as T-Birds captured their first-round OMHA qualifying series two games to nil.

T-Birds grabbed the opener with a 5-0 win Saturday at Memorial Arena before travelling to Dundas Sunday to wrap up their best-of-three series with a 7-3 win.

The series victory advances T-Birds to the next round against arch-rival Georgetown. No dates have yet been set.

In the opener, Don Durand earned the goose-egg as his teammates started slowly before finally catching fire four minutes into the second period.

Travis Cole opened the scoring early in the second period with Wayne Rivers and Andrew Wilson earning assists. Just 20 seconds later, Doug Drennan made it 2-0 with a goal from Cole and Rivers. With five minutes left in the period, Scott Ellwood gave T-Birds a three-goal lead scoring from Rivers with his third assist of the period.

In the final frame, Robbie Wilson and Cole combined for two goals in an eight-second span to close out the scoring. Wilson notched both goals with Cole earning two assists to give him a four-point game.

The next day, T-Birds broke a 2-2 tie with two unanswered second-period goals and then pumped home three consecutive markers in the final frame to sew up the win.

Ellwood started the scoring in the contest at the 7:37 mark of the first period with a goal from Hilson and Pat Butler. Dundas scored the

equalizer six minutes later sending both teams into the middle frame tied at one.

Milton once again took the lead when Robbie Wilson drove home a power-play goal from Marc Banning and Grant Thomson. Again, Dundas bounced back two minutes later to even the score.

However, T-Birds finally broke loose of Dundas rebounding 30 seconds later taking the lead for the final time in the game. David Dillon scored the goal from Ellwood and

Thomson. Geoff Pollen added an unassisted goal on the power play before the period was out to send T-Birds into the third period with a two-goal lead.

The club continued its assault on the Dundas goal in the final frame. Hilson broke the Dundas spirit with a short-handed goal early in the third period from a pretty passing play with Drennan and Rivers.

Dillon added his second of the night from Banning and Cole before Drennan closed out the Milton scoring with a goal from Thomson and Butler.

T-Birds will have their hands full with Georgetown. Last year, Georgetown won the OMHA battle between the two teams before Milton bounced back in the Tri-County playoffs to win the T-C championship over Georgetown.
