# Racer's still first

## Richard Murray returns with vengeance

While the weather was frightful outside Milton Sports Centre Sunday evening, the action inside the arena almost matched it. The first two games of the night were yawners with the most action reserved for the final game of the evening in a match-up between The Racer's Edge and Lou's Place Hawks.

In Milton Industrial Hockey League action, Milton Chrysler-Dodge captured the opener by a 7-1 score over slumping Straight Line Fence; John Burns Stable needed two late third-period tallies to edge a spirited effort from Miltonwe Realty Majors 3-2; and The Racer's Edge maintained its grasp on the top spot with a 5-1 win over Lou's Place.

The final event of the evening was a rousing affair from start to finish with The Edge carrying a 3-0 second-period all the way for the win.

Fresh from a two-game suspension, Richard Murray led the way for Racer's firing three goals and adding an assist as the winners stayed two points ahead of Burns Stable in the hunt for the league crown.

The Edge jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the opening frame on goals from Pete McCuaig and Murray. Racer's added a single from Lester Wilson in the middle frame and then salted the win away with two goals from Murray in the final frame to earn the win.

Al Fritze, playing defence in the absence of the injured Brent Murray, topped the assist-makers in the contest with three while Larry Scott, Bob McKee, Eric Ellison and McCuaig were rewarded with single assists.

Lou D'Arzio spoiled Dave Ballard's shutout bid early in the final frame when he triggered a Guy McGinnis offering.

It was a hectic night for goalie Phil Bailey who was called upon to play three times during the night because of a lack of goalies. Bailey started the evening with Milton Chrysler-Dodge, played with his own John Burns Stable in the middle contest and then suited up for Lou's Place in the finale. Bailey won two games and allowed just eight goals in the three matches.

Milton Chrysler-Dodge scored four times in the opening period and then added three more in the second period to waltz away to the comfortable win over slumping Straight Line Fence which hasn't won since beating The Racer's Edge three weeks ago.

Peter Rota continued his hot scoring exploits with a goal and three assists to spur Cowboys to the lopsided victory.

Tony Tielemans fired a pair of goals for Chrysler while Pat Haggart, Mark Grenke, Gary Hunt and Steve Wilson added singles to the attack.

Grenke picked up a pair of assists while Marty Cairns and Roger Delnin also picked up assists.

Len Smith fired the lone Fence tally from Ralph Serafini midway through the middle frame. The third period was played in straight time and saw many good scoring chances but no goals.

Straight Line goalkeeper Ed House was replaced at the start of the third period by Glen Amis of Miltonwe Realty. House was injured when he was on the receiving end of a charge by Chrysler's Gary Dance midway through the second period. House completed the second period in great pain.

In the middle game, John Burns Stable finally overcame a spirited effort from Miltonwe which, with just six skaters and a goalie, carried a 2-1 lead until the dying minutes. Stable tied the score with three minutes left in the game and then produced the winner with a minute and a half to go.

Miltonwe jumped ahead 1-0 on a goal from Paul Folkes on the power play in the first period. Clarence Haringa and Brian Nowak assisted on the play.

JB Stable bounced back and gained the equalizer two minutes into the second period with Ron Armstrong scoring from John Hellyer and Kevin Howden.

Miltonwe took the lead three minutes into the third period when, on their first good foray into the

offensive zone, Ray Delegrade drove home a slapshot to put his club up 2-1.

Despite having control of the game as Miltonwe's players began tiring, JB Stable couldn't finish off their plays around the goal and Amis, now in his fourth period of play, was outstanding.

However, the bubble burst with Randy Coulson finally clicking from Buddy Thomas and Dave Marshall and a minute later, Thomas scored from a scramble with Don Habkirk and Armstrong assisting.

Slapshots: The results didn't affect the standings much with regard to finalizing positions. The Edge remained two points in front of JB Stable; Chrysler-Dodge moved into a third-place tie with Straight Line Fence; Lou's Place is two back in fifth place; and Miltonwe is definitely assured of a first-round draft choice next season.

Richard Murray became the second player with The Racer's Edge to receive player-of-the-week honors. Murray notched three goals and added an assist to narrowly edge out Peter Rota with his four-point performance and Phil Bailey with his sharp three-game evening.
