scoring in the last minute to produce a point. It marked the conclusion of a perfect week for Steamers who dined Flamboro 4-1 last Monday at Memorial Arena.

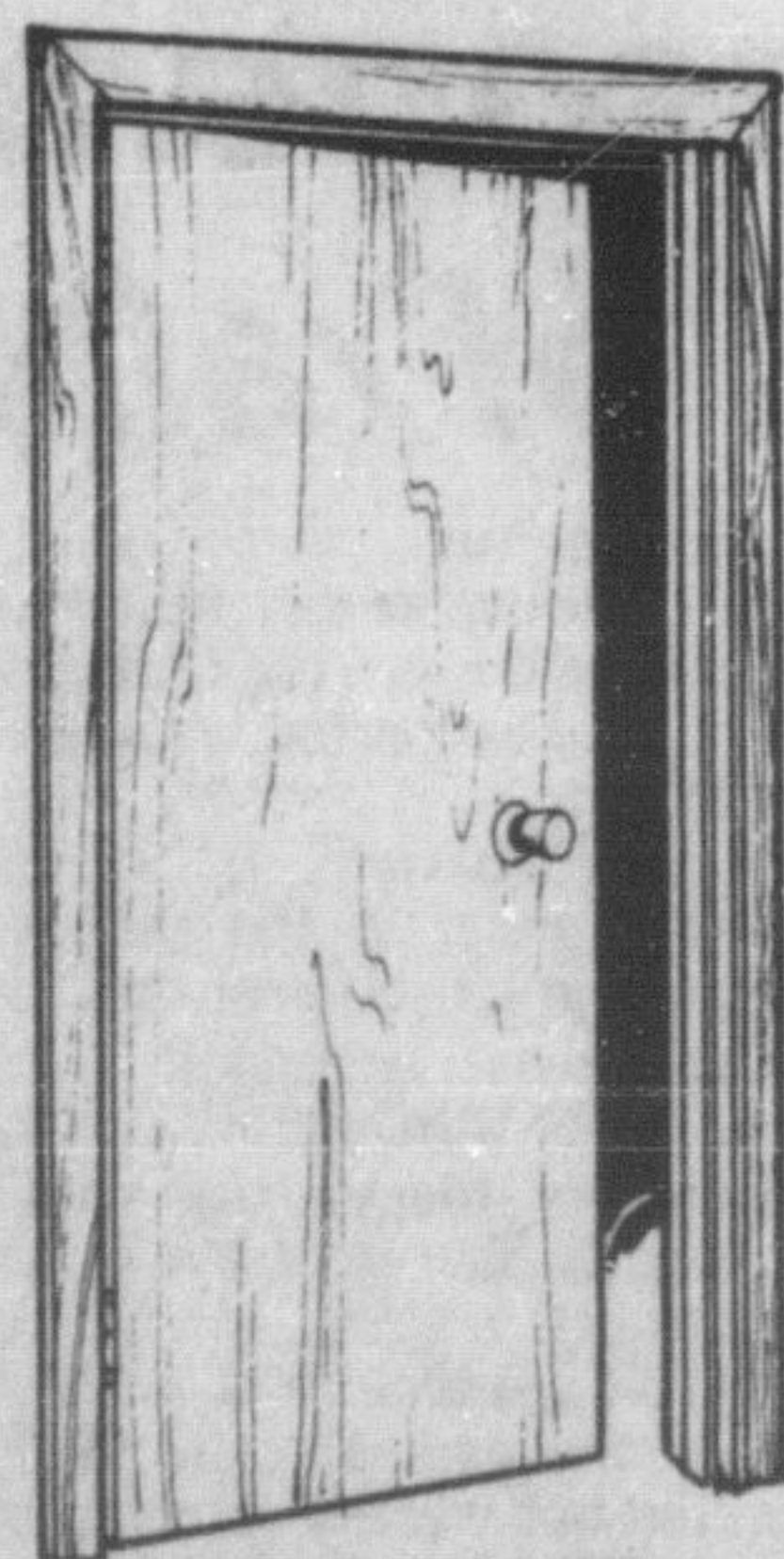
