# Elect officers, future meetings planned

The Halton Farm Safety Council held the joint meeting with guests from Peel County on Tuesday, Feb. 23rd at Omagh Presbyterian church. President Cecil Patterson welcomed those attending and presided. Ted Whitworth of Orangeville fieldman showed two films. The first was on using power tools, stressing that it is important that employers on farm or industry instruct and be sure that all employees know the proper way of working with equipment.

The second film was very timely on wood burning stoves. If properly installed, insulated and with good chimneys, these are quite satisfactory, but often burning soft wood can cause a soot and creosote buildup that could be a hazard.

For the afternoon program following a dinner served by the Omagh church ladies, Mr. Brian Stockton from the Workmen's Compensation Board gave an interesting talk on safety. All employers with five employees must have a first aid station on the building and one person must be qualified to give the necessary help in someone is injured in any way.

The Workmen's Compensation Board will pay for St. John's Ambulance Course training for one person if the employer or farmer is paying to the board. Mr. Stockton is a registered nurse, a radiologist and has many degrees in the medical field. He is director of Safety education, first aid regulations and

programs, working through the Safety Council Associations for the Workmen's Compensation Board. Mr. Warren Anstriss outlined the payroll guide benefits and coverage for Workmen's Compensation Board. For farm workers the rate is \$4.20 per \$100 of payroll, and is compulsory of employing help.

A question period followed, Mr. Sam Schuurman of Caledon, director for Halton and Peel counties brought greetings from the board and gave a brief talk. Reports and treasurer reports showed that the Halton association had sponsored many safety projects in 1981. Hard hats (22 in all) had been given all 4-H first year members completing the agriculture clubs. Cash prizes had been awarded for the safety posters at Milton and Georgetown Fairs—with a good response from the public school children.

A trophy was given to the high member in the tractor club. Four meetings had been held with

films and speakers at each.

The council also aided in the Tractor rodeo to choose competitors to go to the provincial event. A St. John's Ambulance course was held with all who took the training receiving their certificates. Safety signs for the milk house to warn of the danger of mixing cleansing aids were distributed to all dairy farmers. These projects and many more were carried out to stress safety in the home, on the farm, on the road and at school.

The officers elected for 1982 are president Cecil Patterson, vice president John Reed, sec. treas. Marion Patterson. Winners of the lucky draws were Mrs. Schuurman and Lance Pocock, the prizes a first aid kit and welding gloves were donated by Mr. Don Miller of the St. John's Ambulance. A first aid course will be held very soon and any desiring to enroll—contact the president. The council have made plans to continue several of the last year projects and to add more if possible.

The loaves scored high in marks and tasted delicious.

The work period consisted of shaping and baking pioneer potato bread, which was started earlier in the evening. The various types of flour were studied and their content such as protein, carbohydrates, fat, vitamins, minerals, fibre and wheat germ and the food value for good health. Next meeting will be March 8 and members will bring a 100% whole wheat pan loaf for roll call.
