Junior swimmers set Halton record

In the Halton Region swim championships, Graham Lamb, Paul Mazak, Randy McLeod, and Ian Sutherland set a new Halton record in the junior boys' 200-metre freestyle relay with a time of 1:58.08.

The same combination worked together to place second in the 200m medley relay with a time of 2:17.00. Mazak also went on to win the junior boys' 50m freestyle with a time of 28.00. Lamb then placed third in the junior boys backstroke with a time of 35.88 and Sutherland finished fourth in the 100m freestyle.

With these strong performances, the junior boys' team placed third out of the 13 teams competing.

With eighteen swimmers qualifying for the finals, the Drury combined junior and senior boys and girls placed seventh.
