

Burton named Royal president

Allan Burton of Milton has been elected for a two-year term as the 25th president of the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair, according to an announcement by the Board of Directors at the 53rd Annual Meeting.

He replaces David B. Weldon in this capacity. John C. Eaton of Toronto succeeds Mr. Burton as vice-president.

Mr. Burton has been a member of the executive committee and board of directors at the Royal since 1965 and is extremely well known for his business, military and community activities. He is the former chairman and chief executive officer of Simpsons Limited, a company that he served for 44 years until his retirement in 1979. Commissioned at 18, he was on active service, 1940-1945, with the Governor-General's Horse Guards in Italy and Europe and was awarded the D.S.O. in 1945. Mr. Burton subsequently commanded the G.G.H.G. and served as honorary Lieutenant-Colonel for five years until 1971.

An accomplished rider and member of the Eglington Hunt Club (Joint M.F.H., 1953-1974), Mr. Burton

is also a member of The York Club, The Toronto Club, The Rolling Rock Club and The Restigouche Salmon Club.

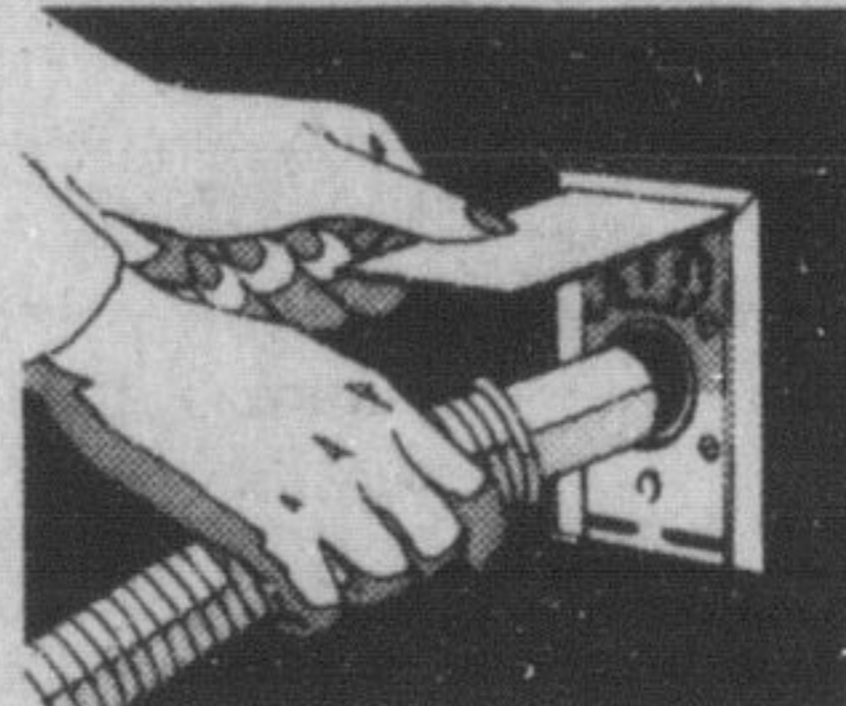

Recipe

Chicken Tacos

Chicken Tacos

Delicious filling for tacos. 3 cups cooked shredded chicken*

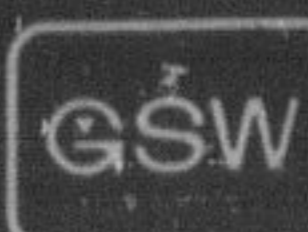
