## Local Baha'i loses kin to Iranians

Baha'i faith who left his native Iran because of the systematic campaign of persecution carried out by the Mus-lim majority there, has been informed that a member of his family, arrested five months ago, has been killed for his beliefs.

Vahdat-i-Haq, Mr. Tehrani's brother-in-law, is now one of 99 leaders of the Baha'i community in Iran to have been imprisoned and killed for their refusal to embrace the faith of Islam.


Both men were executed without trial or public notice and were buried

clandestinely without notification to relatives. These most recent executions bring to 99 the official confirmed total of prominent Baha'i leaders who have been summarily imprisoned and executed by the regime, some after torture, and all after being given the opportunity to go free if they recanted their adherence to the Baha'i faith'' states a press release from the National Spiritual Assembly of Baha'is in Canada.

Mr. Tehrani said his family has been concerned for the safety of their relative since he was arrested by the Iranian regime last October.

Although held in a prison in Tehran for those five months, he was never officially charged with any crime or given the opportunity to appear before






