Stouffville sinks Plumbers for Int. C provincial championship

Andrea Ticker dashed the title hopes of Milton Currie Plumbers with two goals to lead Stouffville to a 3-1 win over Milton for the OWA Intermediate girls C division championship Sunday afternoon at Carlisle Community Centre.

The Milton club had trouble getting its offence untracked in the early going as Stouffville built a 2-0 lead after two periods.

However, midway through the final frame Peggy Finn, who led Plumbers' scorers with five goals in the tourney, produced a dramatic finish with a goal from Tracy Horne to narrow the gap to a single tally.

Despite pressing and pulling the goalie over the final stretch, Plumbers couldn't find the equalizer. Stouffville's Julie Thompson poked home an empty-net goal with just a second left in the contest to sew up the win and the championship.

The Milton Girls Hockey Association hosted all three divisional Ontario Women's Hockey Association Intermediate championships with action spanning Saturday and Sunday in Carlisle. Toronto Penguins captured the "A" division with a 5-4 overtime victory over Belleville. Ottawa Nepean claimed the Intermediate B title with a 5-3 win over Rice Lake Rebels.

For Milton's Currie Plumbers, the club put on two dramatic showings in the preliminary games to advance to the championship game.

Plumbers began with the tournament's first game Saturday morning at 8 a.m. against Stouffville. It took almost two overtime periods before Milton secured a

3-2 victory. In the second game, overtime was once again required before Plumbers advanced to the finals with a 3-2 win, again in dramatic fashion.

Stouffville and Plumbers played almost two complete periods before Stouffville's Julie Thompson broke the scoreless contest with the game's first goal 48 seconds from the end of the second period.

Then the dramatics started. First, Finn scored the equalizer midway through the period for Plumbers from defender Rhonda Reynolds and Horne. Thompson scored the go-ahead goal with just 1:23 to go in the game and Stouffville appeared headed for the win.

However, Finn came back to notch up the tying goal with just 33 seconds remaining from Joanne Auger and Jackie Bergin to force overtime.

The teams played even for the first overtime period forcing the second extra-time period. The tournament adopted a rule whereas the goalies were removed for the second overtime period.

Two minutes later, Lisa Simpson drove a shot into the vacated goal to give Plumbers the win. The overtime game forced the day's activities to be moved back an hour.

Plumbers weren't finished with exciting games and in their second encounter of the day six hours later needed another overtime goal to pull out a 4-3 win over Aylmer Flames.

Horne scored the winning goal three minutes into the first overtime period. She picked up the puck at centre ice and with an excellent skating effort pulled away from the Aylmer defence for a breakaway.

Aylmer goalie Angela Clarkson made a nice play to stop Horne on the breakaway. The puck went into the corner and, attempting to pass in front, the centre ricocheted the puck off the goalie's skate into the goal for the winning marker.

The two teams were virtually even during regulation time with Milton goalkeeper Barb Edwards coming up with some steady stops to keep her teammates in the seesaw game.

After Aylmer opened the scoring early in the first period, Horne scored the equalizer a minute into the second period.

Two minutes later, Finn banked a shot off the goalie's stick into the goal for a 2-1 lead and Plumbers appeared on their way.

Aylmer rallied to even the score early in the third period. However, Finn put Plumbers back out in front with a power-play tally from in front of the goal finishing off a Horne-Simpson relay with 3:41 to go.

Finn almost put the game out of reach in the final minute when she unleashed a blistering slapshot from just inside the blue line which had Clarkson shaking her head but the shot went over the net.

Plumbers continued to apply continued pressure in the final minute before Milton coughed up a loose puck and Karen Kapogines passed ahead to Tammy Chauvin on a breakaway. Chauvin made no mistake with a wrist shot for the tying goal with just eight seconds left in regulation time.

In other results of C division play, Stouffville defeated Baltimore, Ont. 7-3; Otonabee beat Baltimore 3-1; and Aylmer edged Otonabee 3-2.
