


Self starters

Following up on last week's column on the family constellation and birth order of children, Dr. Thomas Connellan, director of The Achievement Institute, writes that self-starters and super-achievers are usually the first-born.

This was revealed by a survey of astronauts, top-ranking scientists, and other over-achievers. There are three factors at work that determine the self-starting mechanism in these people. They are: very high expectations-people expected them to achieve great things, more responsibility was given to them at an earlier age, and more feedback and attention was shown to what they were doing.

These same three factors can be used to turn children (and young adults) who are not first born into self-starters. Our expectations influence others, often in subtle ways, and inadvertantly, parents communicate their expectations to their children. When they expect great things from their children, the children will usually measure up to it. When they have low expectations, the children tend to just do enough to get by.

It's not enough just to give children responsibility. They should also be accountable for the results. They should also learn to set goals-not unattainable goals.




