Lorena Smith, Halton Centennial Manor's volunteer co-ordinator, has organized a comprehensive display in conjunction with the North Halton Volunteer Centre which will involve many local agencies which require volunteer services to operate.

The Manor auditorium at Petit House will be open to the public from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesday, April 20 and will feature various agencies and organizations which utilize volunteers. A luncheon will be followed by a lecture by guest speaker Cindy Lebrocq, who has been a volunteer in many capacities for 32 years. Mrs. Smith said the speaker's vast and various experiences make her an interesting person to listen to. She also has an entertaining sense of

The student employment supervisor explained the advantage of having students available at short notice and ready to take on casual jobs of five days duration or less.






