Halton Regional Police are investigating a break and enter of a Milton home that occurred over the weekend.

Police said a large quantity of stereo equipment, assorted jewelry and a television converter were taken from the home of Kenneth Burtch at 481 Pitfield Cr.

Thieves ransack Premier Theatres

Halton Regional Police are investigating a break-in at Milton Premier Theatres that occurred over the weekend.

Thieves looking for money, ransacked the triple theatre complex and caused more than \$2,000 damage, said police.

Four pinball machines and another video machine were smashed, said police.

Coinage was stolen from the machines and two desks in the movie theatre were also ransacked.

Police said the break-in was discovered Saturday at noon when an employee arrived to begin his shift.

Youth stands trial on eight charges

A 19-year-old Milton youth has been committed to stand trial in connection with eight break and enter charges and two separate theft charges.

Robert Adams of 3316 Lower Base Line Rd. appeared in Milton Provincial Court last week for a preliminary hearing into the charges.

An inmate of Guelph Correctional Centre, Mr. Adams escaped from jail last September 28.

He was arrested a month later by Quebec Provincial Police.

Mr. Adams is charged with breaking into a number of Milton businesses, including two car dealerships, a book store, a stereo shop and an office building.

He has elected to be tried by a judge and jury.

Stereo equipment stolen Saturday

Halton Regional Police are investigating the weekend theft of stereo equipment from a Milton residence.

An estimated \$4,000 worth of equipment was taken from the home of Donald Christie at Lot 9, Fifth Line sometime between Saturday afternoon and Sunday evening.

Police said thieves broke through a garage door leading into the house.

According to police, the motorcycle shop at 32 Bronte St. was broken into during the early morning hours of Saturday and a Honda bike and other items were taken.

Mr. Deakin is scheduled to appear in Milton provincial court Monday May 10.

Kindergarten breaks up home

Two Halton separate school trustees are against the implementation of a junior kindergarten program, because they say it will lead to the breakdown of the family unit.

The program, which is supported by a group of mothers from across the region and could start in the fall, will encourage families to push their children out of the home at an earlier age, explained Dennis Delorme, Burlington trustee, at an education committee meeting, Tuesday.

"The parents are primarily responsible for the education of their children. Children are young for only so long and junior kindergarten would already start to indicate to them the breakdown of family ties. I strongly urge we do not push our children away from the family," Delorme said.

Michael Boyle, Oakville trustee, agreed with Delorme. "We are looking at quite a division amongst educators with day care on one side and junior kindergarten on the other. The breakdown of the family unit would be a result of a junior kindergarten program," Boyle said.

Junior kindergarten programs are in place in Dufferin-Peel, Hamilton-Wentworth and Toronto in separate schools, according to Dennis Nolan, superintendent for the Halton separate school board. He knew of no board in Ontario which withdrew from the junior kindergarten program once it was in place.


