### Crawford Lake

# Fundraising getting underway

Paul Crowley, general manager of Babcock Wilcox, is aiming at two targets in the Crawford Lake Indian Village and Conservation Centre fundraising campaign.

One target is the \$700,000. his canvassing team will be attempting to raise during a six-week campaign beginning Sunday, May 2. The other is the target he will be aiming at with a bow and arrow during the ceremonial start of the fundraising drive at the lake.

The target-shooting is just one of the special events planned at Crawford Lakeon Guelph Line at Steeles Avenue-from 10 a.m. to 4 p,m. Sunday, May 2. All members of the public are invited to attend.

Crawford Lake is the site of the most accurately dated prehistoric Indian village in Canada. Construction of the first of at least six longhouses that made up the original village-which flourished from 1434 to 1459—will begin this summer. The village will be the second in Canada rebuilt on its original site.

A second phase of the project is to build a nature interpretive centre, to provide information about Indian culture and heritage, archaeology, biology, botany, the Niagara Escarpment, and the unique aspects of Crawford Lake.

Visitors at Crawford Lake will be able to ride to the nearby sheer cliffs of the Niagara Escarpment in a horse drawn wagon-or rise above the events on the ground in a hot-air balloon, to take pictures of the lake and surrounding woods.

Honorary campaign chairman, Allan Burton, the former president of Simpsons Ltd., will assist with the official campaign kickoff ceremonies at 2 p.m. Representatives of the provincial government will cut a ribbon to open the elevated boardwalk which circles the lake.

No water activities will be permitted in Crawford Lake-to preserve the unique structure of the lake bottom. Sediment on the bottom is arranged in distinct layers, which enables researchers to date accurately pollen, seeds, and other material found on the lake bottom.

Other events scheduled throughout the day on May 2 include a display of Iroquois pipes from the Royal Ontario Museum, explanation of archaeology techniques by officials of the Museum of Indian Archaeology in London, Ontario; Indian art and performances by members of the Woodland Indian Cultural and Education Centre in Brantford; bird banding demonstrations; and a conservation exhibition by the Halton Region Conservation Authority.

Visitors will be able to buy lunch of pancakes and sausages during the day-with proceeds going to the Crawford Lake campaign. Pins and posters will also be on

Crawford Lake is located on a 180-acre site acquired by the Halton Region Conservation Authority more than 10 years ago. The funds are being raised by volunteers from all across Halton, working with the Halton Region Conservation Foundation.

Andrew and Holly are part of a unique 15-member family.


According to Derek Wood he is the only Giant Schnauzer breeder in the area and Holly's latest litter of 13 pups is one of a kind in
