More than rock and roll

They don't call themselves punkers, but they are certainly something more than your average rock and roll band.

"High Society", as the group is known, aims to please a variety of music fans from Pat Benatar followers to Sweeney Todd lovers.

They describe their music as a combination of "new wave" and rock or, in their words, "progressive rock."

The five members include two Milton District High School students, Carm Crisci and Mark Clarke. There is also Bruce Francis from Milton.

Simon Rainford of Brampton and Geoff Saxon from Bramalea.

It was lead singer Carm Crisci's brother John, who organized the present combo in January of 1980, but later left the group to give his full attention to college studies.

Most of the members have known each other for several years and played together prior to formally becoming "High Society."

Adhering to a strict schedule of weekly practices over the past year has earned the group local recognition and a few outside gigs.

Last week they returned to perform at White Oaks Restaurant in Milton.

They have played at Hallon Hills Place on Steeles Ave. and last summer competed and placed second in a "Battle of the Bands" in Oshawa.

"Our main goal is to please people in an age group from 15 to 35 years," said Bruce Francis, who sings and writes some of the group's original material.

"We are not a hard rock group that is going to blow your ear drums out," he said.

"We are all middle class kids who want to make it with this band," said Mark Clarke.

"We are looking to put together a good act."

Their sets include music from April Wine, Lover Boy, The Police, Max Webster, Toronto and The Pretenders.


