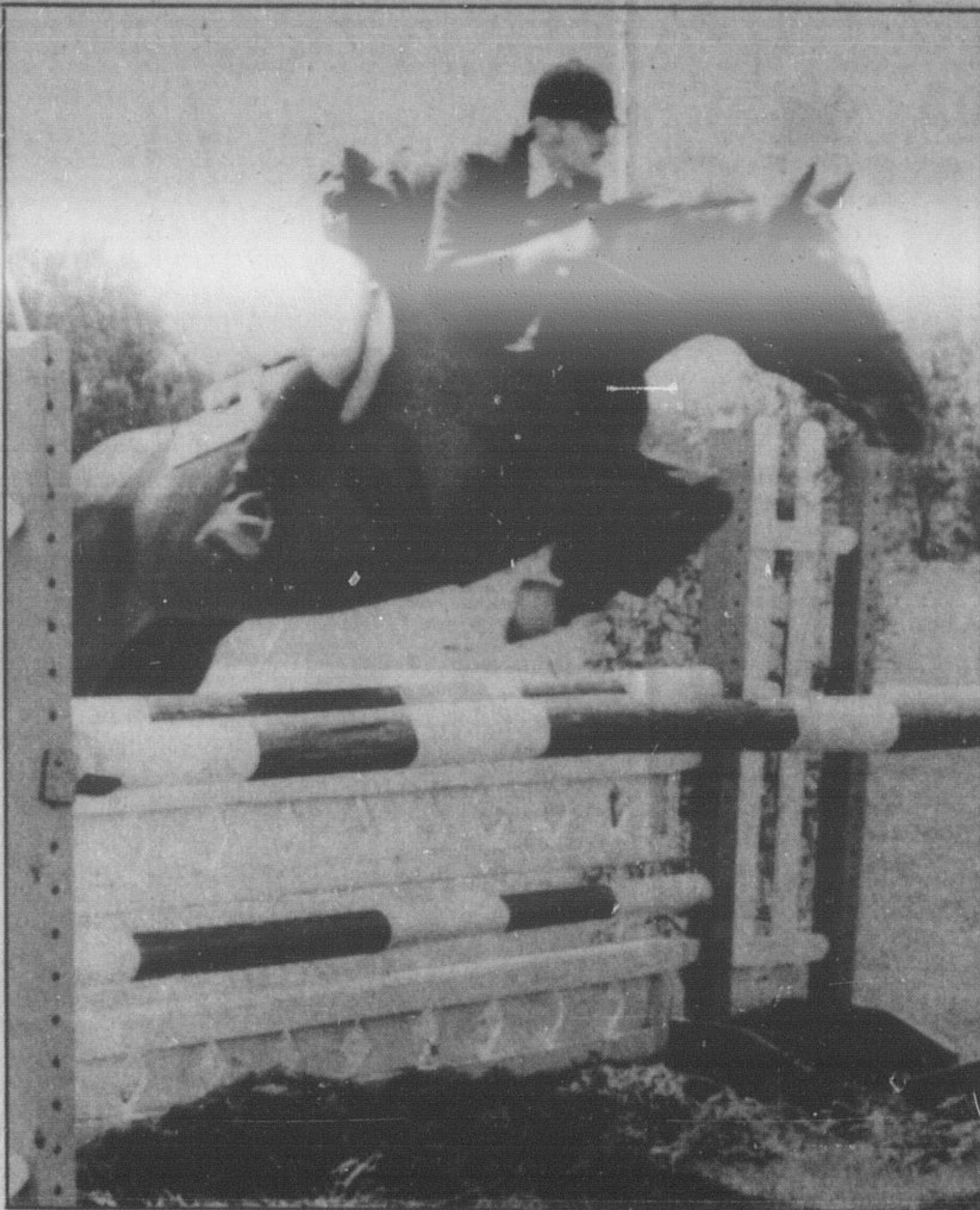

Meanwhile, Stokes Milk recorded its second straight win after going the first 11 games without a win by beating Milton Music.

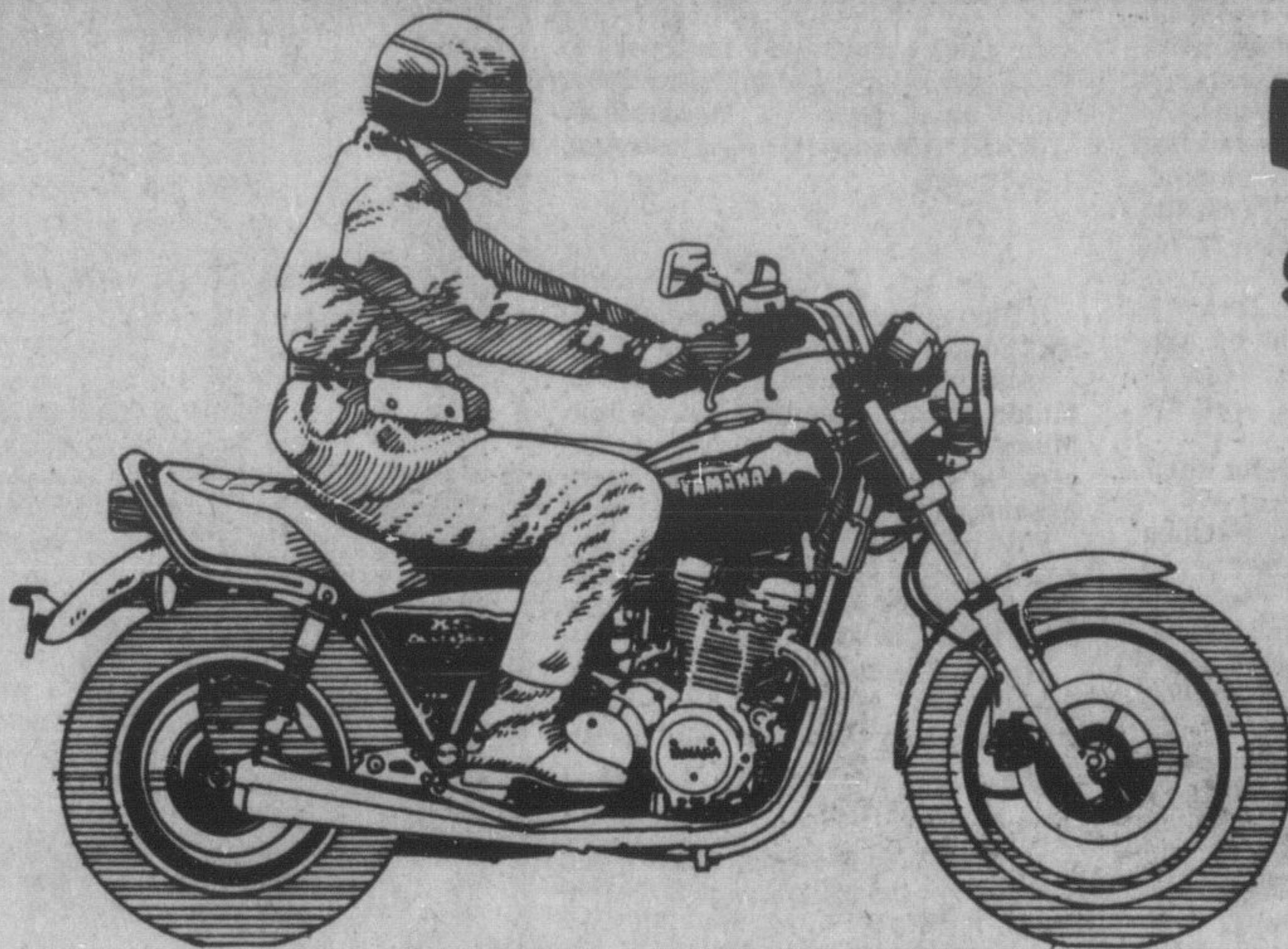
The two clubs were locked in a close game until Stokes struck for five runs in each of the seventh and eighth innings.

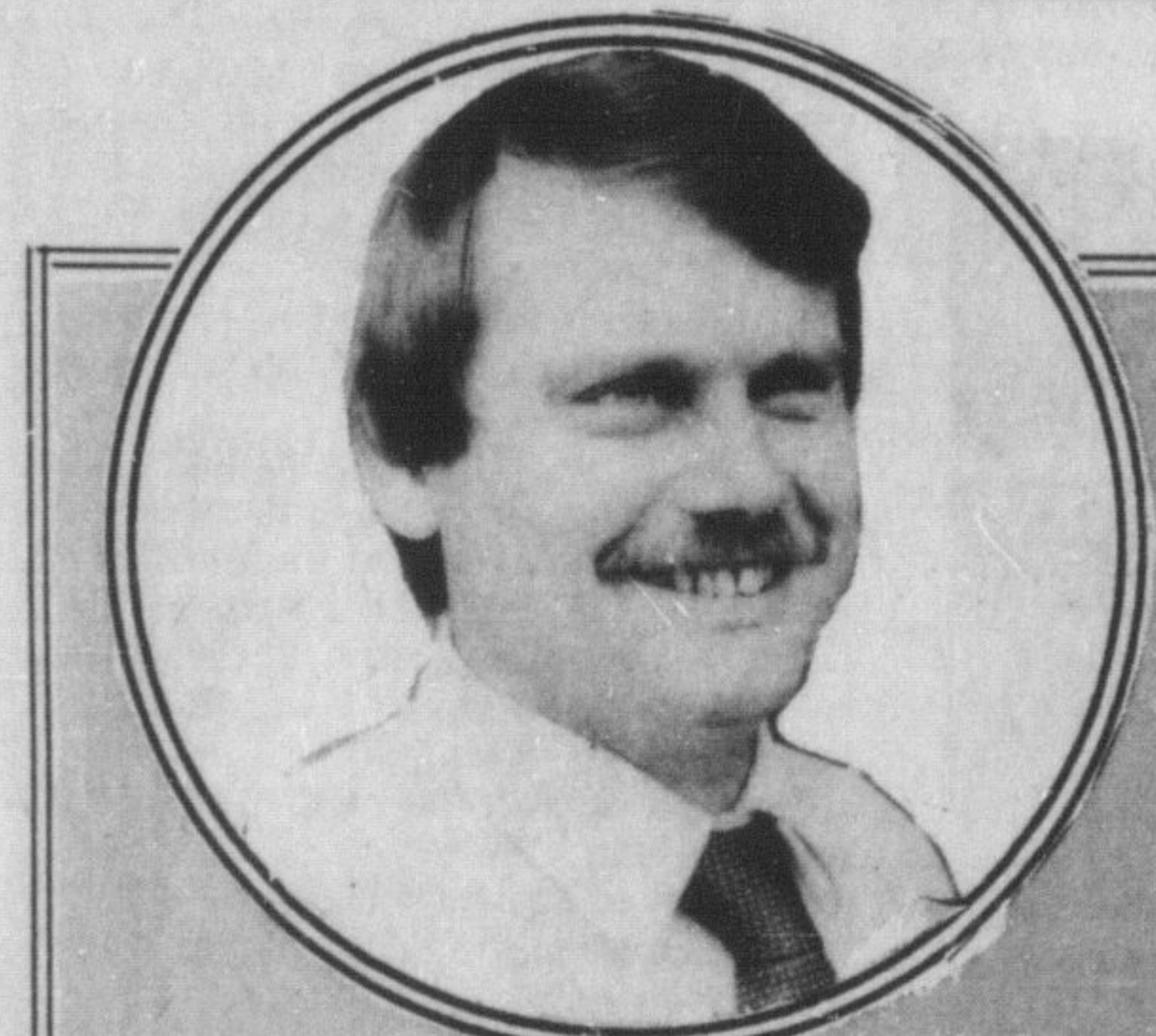
