Oilers within striking distance of clinching first place in the MFL

Only a complete breakdown will prevent Thornborrow Oilers from taking the Milton Fastball League season title this year.

With a 5½ game bulge on the rest of the Pack, and with about 10 games remaining, Oilers will have to hit the skids something fierce for the club to finish anything but first.

Oilers showed their winning form last week, in an abbreviated schedule, sailing by McDuffe Equipment 5-0.

Tony Broussard threw a two-hitter and didn't allow a McDuffe runner past second base to lead Oilers to their 17th win against one loss and three ties. Coupled with some strong fielding plays, Broussard faced just 23 batters, two over the minimum.

Oilers broke into the lead in the second inning. After Ray Tonelli reached on an error, Roger Johnston followed with a run-scoring double. Tonelli upped the lead to 2-0 when his RBI-double in the third drove home Wayne Ellis.

Oilers collected their final three runs in the fifth. Don Hearn led off with a double. Bruce Miller advanced Hearn with a single and they both came home on Geoff O'Brien's triple. Johnson produced the final run with a single, knocking in O'Brien.

Rob Amos went the first six innings for McDuffe and was saddled with the loss. Pie Lee and Peter McDuffe managed singles off Broussard.

In the two other games of the week, McDuffe blanked Thruway 6-0 on Barry Timbers' two-hitter before Fifth Wheel and Lowville played to a 6-6 tie.

Peter McDuffe connected for two hits including a homer, scored three runs and knocked in two to lead McDuffe past the slumping Thruway Mufflers.

Timbers held Thruway to just two hits, both with two out, and struck out nine.

McDuffe started quickly with three runs in the first, one in the third, one in the fifth and two more in the sixth.

Frank Robinson led off with a double off Thruway starter Ted Moore. Dave Norton followed with a walk. Peter McDuffe singled home Robinson before Pie Lee drove home two more with a single.

Peter McDuffe walked to lead off the third and scored on errors before belting a solo shot in the fifth. Timbers singled home Hugh Williams in the sixth before Robinson belted a triple to score Timbers with McDuffe's sixth run.

Paul Wannamaker and Moore each touched Timbers for doubles for Thruway.

If Lowville has a favorite team in the MFL it is Fifth Wheel. Both wins and one of its two ties have come at the expense of Fifth Wheel.

Last Tuesday, Fifth Wheel needed to come from behind with single runs in the fifth and seventh to pull out the tie.

Ray Deegar started on the mound for Fifth Wheel and was roughed up for five runs in the first two innings before settling down and allowing Lowville just one run and one hit the rest of the way.

Fifth Wheel out-hit Lowville 11-7 with each club committing three errors.

Paul McCann paced Wheelers with three hits and two runs batted in while Kevin Smith scored three runs and had two hits including a homer. Chris Heath also managed a pair of hits.

Pete Pitcher led Lowville with three hits and three runs scored while Don McDonald, Bill Palko, Ernie King and Dan Carway each drove home a run.

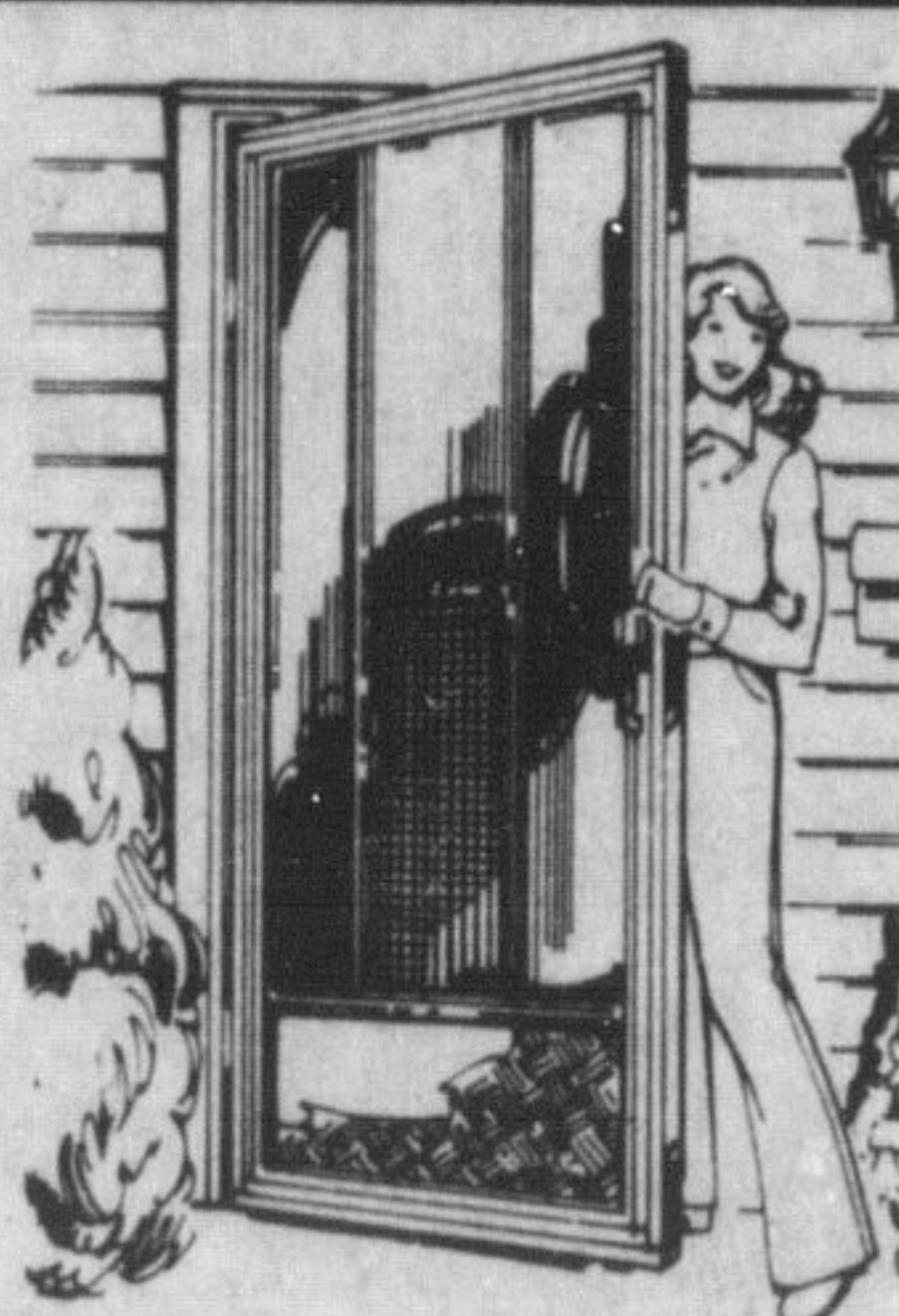
