# Local resident builds Italian racers

It is with a certain amount of pride that Miltor resident Joe Gardin wheels out a red and black bicycle.

Weighing about 19.5 pounds, constructed of ultra-light alloys, and featuring the most ad vanced components made, it also bears the engraved name "Gardin".

Like Victor Hasselblad and Dr. Ferry Porsche who build cameras and cars respectively and who proudly attach their names to their products, Jo€ Gardin now builds a bicycle which he believes is one of the best in the world. And, it carries his name to back up the bike's quality.

Since he was 9 years old and living in Italy. bicycling has been in the Gardin family. He racec and sold bikes there. His cousin operated a cycle shop featuring some of the best equipment of the

At the age of 18 he left for Canada, arriving here in 1955. By 1959 he had started Mobile Materials Handling Equipment Ltd., which manufactures lift trucks. With a comfortable home set in the wooded hills of north Milton, Joe Gardin had it

made. About four years ago, however, he noticed a paunch forming and bought a bike to go out and do a little road work.

The experience "was terrible, it was a lousy bike so I put it away."

But a few weeks later he was out again. He was going further but he wasn't enjoying it as much as he used to when he was a kid.

And that's when a chance meeting while on a business trip to Italy put Joe Gardin in touch with the sales representative for Cambio Rino bicycles,

a high-quality line made in Italy.

"We talked the same language, the bicycle language," he said. That led to Joe Gardin becoming the North American arm of Cambio Rino.

From assembling components, Joe used his metal shops to start producing frames and wheels. Tying up Pirelli bicycle tires for North America also helped, and today the firm has some 95 dealers across Canada and they are now penetrating the U.S. market.

In addition to the Gardin, which debuts in 1983, his Cambio Rino line runs from the \$675 Corsa, to the \$975 Crono. Other, aerodynamic models cost considerably more.

But buying a bicycle at \$675 has a lot of advantages compared to a \$250 bike, according to

"In any sport, when you buy the best equipment

it is going to give you the best results. "If a boy is a good hockey player, you don't buy him cheap skates, you get him the best so he can use all his potential. It's the same with bicycles,"

"You've got to remember that with a bike, you are the motor. If you have a lighter car, it's going to go further on a tank of gas than a heavy car. "If you are pushing a 30-pound bike, it's going to

take more out of you than a 20-pound bike." Closely involved with bicycle racing since he's come to Canada, Joe also sponsors an Ontario and National Cambio Rino team, complete with full equipment right down to the socks with the Cambio Rino name on them.

Team coach Des Dickie has just returned from the Ontario championships on the weekend where

the team took first place and a huge silver trophy. Mr. Dickie has formed the team from unknowns and already they are winning on a national level, "something that's unheard of," he said.

Joe is also living proof that, at the age of 47, anyone can go out and get into top shape. He rides regularly with his son, Joe, covering a good 50 kilometres a trip.


