The newlyweds have returned from their honeymoon in Cape Cod and are now residing in Milton.

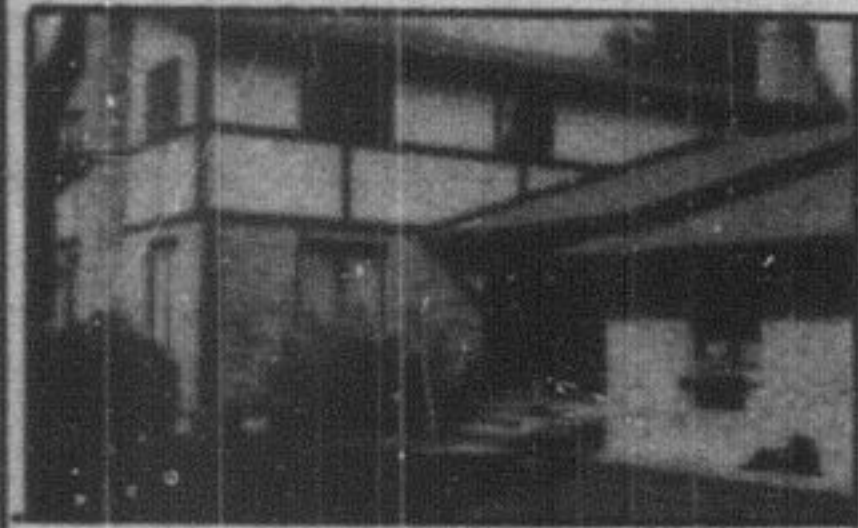
