

# Royals advance sweep Rangers

Despite getting a tougher battle from Cambridge Rangers than expected, Milton Royals captured their best-of-three playoff series in two consecutive games to advance to the Halton Senior League championship tournament.

Royal snuck by Cambridge with a pair of one-run victories. Royals edged Rangers 4-3 in Cambridge Saturday before sweeping the best-of-three series with a 13-12 win Sunday at Brian Best Park.

Jack Cantelon hit a two-out, run-scoring single in the eighth inning to provide Royals with the margin of difference Saturday. Gary Naylor scored from second on the play. Naylor had connected for his third hit of the game.

After Royals jumped ahead 1-0 in the top of the first, Cambridge marched back to take the lead with a run in the second and two in the third. Royals evened the score with a pair of unearned runs in the fourth. Wade Bekar picked up the win on the mound.

The two teams met in a genuine barn-burner Sunday at Brian Best Park. Royals threatened to run away and hide when their first five

batters scored before an out. Rangers bounced back and knotted the score at 6-6 in the fourth inning. The seesaw battle continued until the late innings when Gary Naylor drove home Rich Clement with the winning run in the bottom of the ninth.

Wayne Marchand pitched to just one batter, the last out of the Cambridge eighth, and received credit for the win. He was preceded to the mound by starter Dave Turner, George Moore and Roger Clement.

Rick McTrach and Cantelon paced Royals' 17-hit attack with three each while Gary Naylor, Doug Naylor, Brad Holmes and John Turner added two hits apiece.

Cantelon and Gary Naylor picked up three RBIs each while John Turner added two ribbies. Glen Turner distinguished himself by picking up four walks.

Notes: Royals now advance to the league's four-team championship tournament the weekend of Sept. 11-12.
