Refreshments and a short business meeting were followed by a fun evening of socializing and table games. Everyone enjoyed the new members and re-newing friendships with the not so new.

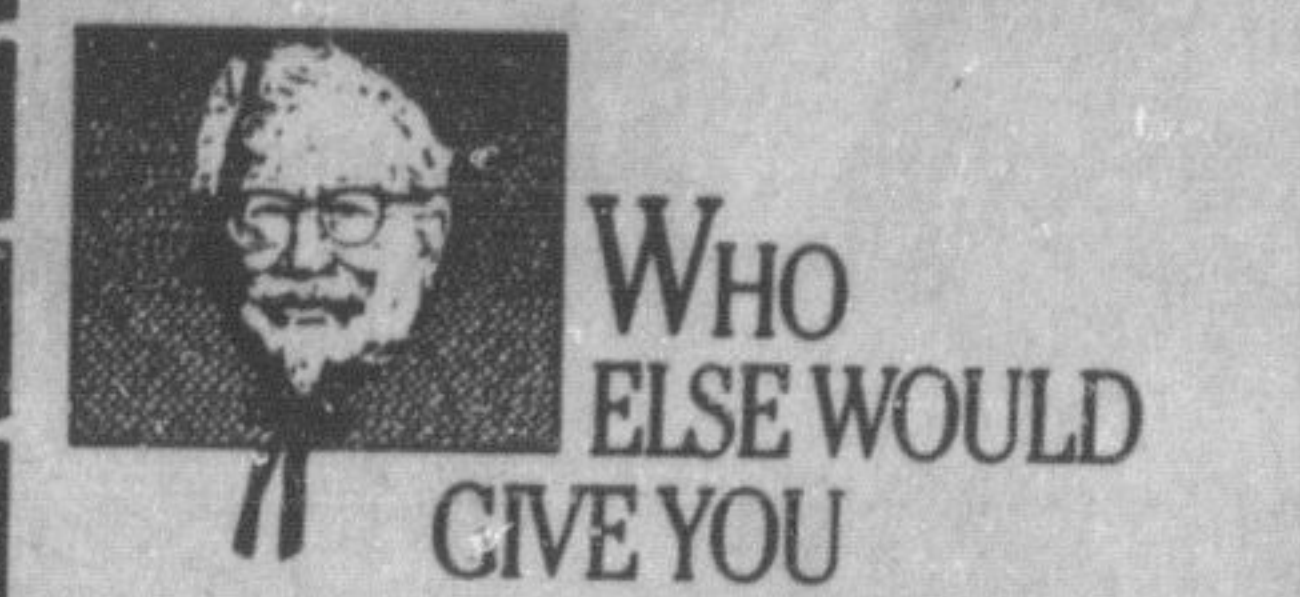
During the business meeting activity groups for this year were discussed and new members welcomed.
