# Police station repairs cost Region \$169,000

Repairs to two of Halton's four police stations could mean interest charges on \$169,000 in debentures for Regional taxpayers.

Rather than face those charges however, members of the administration and finance committee last week recommended scouring existing budgets for the extra

Committee members were told that police stations in Milton, Burlington, Oakville and Georgetown all require repair and renovation work and that at least part of the work is recommended for

financing through debentures.

Dennis Perlin, chief administrative officer, told committee members that \$168,910 would be needed to do required repairs to the stations in Milton and Oakville. Money for the Burlington and Georgetown repairs has already been found within the current budgets.

"We're taking some of the money from certain other things that aren't going to be fully expended this

year," Mr. Perlin said. Police chief James Harding added that some money will be available "from deferred hiring because of a recruiting problem and some very strict control of our overtime."

He added that repairs to the Milton facility's roof were badly needed and have been delayed for several years.

"It's always been known in the department that the roof there isn't everything it could be, but the expenditure is worthwhile because we'll get several years' life out of that building yet," he said.

Work on the Oakville station, he said, would include a redesign of the target range, closed by Provincial health officials because poor circulation caused a build-up of lead in the air.

"We've already had a study of that problem, but before we could get it implemented the construction cost had escalated," Chief Harding

Milton Mayor Gord Krantz, along with Oakville Mayor Harry Barrett, suggested stalling on debenture issues right now.

"We should wait until the end of the year and see what our financial situation is then," Mr. Barrett said. Mr. Krantz urged that efforts be made to find the money in the current budget, before debentures are issued at current high interest


