Halton Videos

Journey into semi-finals

On the weekend Halton Videos journeyed to Bradford for the Bradford and District Soccer Tournament. They won their way into the semi-final against Whitby after two convincing wins against Port Elgin and Bradford.

The first game was against Port Elgin and Videos came out on top 3-1. Port Elgin took an early lead 1-0 at the 6th minute mark, after a good run through the centre by the Port Elgin inside right.

After that Milton settled down and passed the ball with good control, this eventually forced a corner from which Tim Spencer found the net to tie the game 1-1. Two minutes later Adel Sharaf broke through and just missed a score.

Videos went out in front 2-1 at the 17th minute mark, after a beautiful left wing rush by Tim Spencer. He passed inside to Adel Sharaf, who made no mistake with his high rising shot.

The second half saw Videos dominate the play, with good play by Chris Chamberlain and David Altoft just missing with wide shots.

The only Port Elgin threat was nullified by Tim Spencer's defensive run at the 17th minute mark and saved a certain goal. Milton added their third marker at the 18th minute mark after a goalmouth scramble, and Paul Carles found the net for his first goal of the season.

Two hours later Videos took on Bradford the next club and played superbly to win 4-1 and a berth in the semi-final.

Milton dominated the play in the first half again with good passing, plenty of hustle and good defensive play.

They scored the first goal at the 4 minute mark from Roy Jones after taking a left wing pass from Tim Spencer. Videos scored again two minutes later after hard working David Altoft let fly from way out and it curled under the bar giving the Bradford keeper no chance.

Two minutes later again, Sandy Sharma picked a goal kick and blasted it in to put Videos in front 3-0.

Good work by Adel Sharaf in conjunction with Chris Chamberlain and Chris Baillie kept pressure on Bradford and only spectacular goal keeping prevented further scoring, and the half ended 3-0.

Bradford's only goal was an own goal at the 14th minute mark off a Video defender giving goalie Lee Stoker no chance and spoiling a well earned shut out.

Altogether a fine display of soccer by the Video players, they put it all together and thoroughly deserved their two victories.
