

# Medics open season with excellent efforts

Milton Docs and Dents minor atoms opened their Tri-County league season on home ice Saturday with an impressive 4-2 win against Oakville. The entire Milton squad showed tremendous drive from the outset and quickly took the lead when Michael Lee scored goal number one from a Mike Cox pass only 1:27 into the game.

Two overlapping Milton penalties midway through the first period produced some tense moments for the home team defence, but good back-checking and the sound goaltending of Ryan Peddie prevented Oakville from taking advantage.

Milton kept up the pressure in the middle frame and were rewarded at 6:39 when a long shot from Ian Ellis found the top left corner of the net with Lee picking up the assist.

Two defensive lapses early in the third allowed the visitors to tie it up at 2-2 with goals from close range.

Milton rebounded quickly however when Ian Ellis registered his second goal of the game with a low shot from 39 feet out. This was followed up with 3:34 remaining when Damien Dubien dug out the puck from behind the Oakville net and slipped in a backhander around the left post to give Milton their well-earned 4-2 victory.

Milton's first away game of the season the next day against a strong Burlington club was highlighted by tremendous action and tenacious checking by both clubs.

However, Burlington opened the scoring at 6:38 of the first period on a deflection following several fine stops by goalkeeper Peter Downs. Trevor Brandt came close to tying the game on a crossing shot which grazed the post in the final moments of the period.

Burlington surged ahead 2-0 early in the middle frame but were prevented from furthering their lead by some

determined checking from Milton's Kevin Davidson, Jason May and David McDuffe. Finally after two shots by Robbie Crowe were blocked, Milton's first marker was scored by Glen McBryde assisted by Ellis and Russell McLean.

However, Milton roared back with goals from Crowe, assisted by Cox, and McBryde's second of the match.

Brandt scored the equalizer resulting from a rink-long rush and a determined effort. Brandt forced the puck past the sprawled goalkeeper.

Burlington regained its two-goal advantage with a pair of quick tallies but Milton closed

to 6-5 with just 14 seconds left in the game. Cox drove home a shot after Jarret Blanchard won the face-off.

Docs and Dents continued their hectic league schedule in Orangeville on Monday evening with an excel-

lent 4-1 victory that owed much to the outstanding goaltending of Ryan Peddie.

Peddie pulled off a series of brilliant saves in the last period, but was denied a shutout only 21 seconds from the final buzzer when Orangeville scored.

## Legion enjoys a party for holiday

Banning scored the first of his trio firing in a pass from Meli with 4:08 remaining in the first period. Meli then upped the margin to 4-0 as his hard work paid off on a fine solo dash. Sheldon Lieba put Orangeville on the scoreboard as he

scored his first of a pair with 2:16 left in the period.

Meli finished off a Paul Carles-Darren Beals relay a minute and a half into the middle period to up the score to 5-1. With just under four minutes remaining in the second frame, Banning converted a Meli-Robbie Del Papa offering for his second marker.

Dillon gave the winners a 7-1 lead with 5:24 left in the final stanza as he was the trigger-man on a play with Bradley and Del Papa. Fifteen seconds later, Lieba brought the visitors to a 7-2 disadvantage. Only 22 seconds later, Banning fired his and the team's final goal of the night as he tipped in a Carles pass.

In the Streetsville game, the Legionaires were on the short end of 2-0 and 2-1 period scores and were only able to equal Streetsville 2-2 in the final period.

James Green finally put the Milton crew on the scoreboard with the clock only showing 31 seconds left in the middle

stanza. Green triggered a relay from Danny Hierman and Darren Beals.

Bryan Reynolds put Streetsville ahead 3-1 early in the final period before Paul Carles added a Legionaire marker on a solo effort. Shane Buckle scored the eventual winning goal for the host team with 3:14 left in the contest.
