Entertaining on a small budget is not an impossible task.

One of the most economical ways is to invite friends for a Sunday brunch, with Quiche Lorraine as the main course. Bacon, cheese and onion add flavor and texture to the scrambled egg pie.

Team the main dish with fresh fruit and rolls for a complete meal that won't inflate your grocery bill.

QUICHE LORRAINE
(Makes 5 to 6 servings)
8 slices fried bacon
9-inch unbaked pastry shell
1 1/2 cups (6 ounces) shredded Swiss Cheese

1/2 cup thinly sliced onion rings
1 tablespoon flour 1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 2 3 cups undiluted evaporated milk
4 beaten eggs
Crumble bacon in unbaked pastry shell. Cover with cheese and onion slices. Combine flour, salt and pepper. Gradually add evaporated milk mixture; blend well. Pour into pastry shell. Bake in moderate oven (375 degrees F.) 30 to 40 minutes, or until knife inserted near centre comes out clean. Let stand 5 minutes before serving.

When buying clothes—especially for children—it pays to look for 25% water wash garments that require no ironing. You'll save hot water, electricity, and your time and energy.

Both milk and water leave difficult-to-remove spots on stainless steel flatware. Rinse milk off immediately and prevent water spotting by towel drying utensils after they are washed.

Before hanging a group of pictures on a wall, spread a large sheet of brown paper on the floor below and arrange pictures on it. Outline their shapes lightly, tape up pattern, and mark wall exactly where nails should go.

Heat nails in hot water before driving them into a plaster wall and you'll be amazed at how smoothly they enter, leaving no chips or cracks.
