Perri Hood struck for two unassisted markers in the third period to help lift Milton Dufferin Aggregates to a 4-2 win over Brampton Saturday at Brampton.

Aggies managed a split on the weekend when Chinguacousy doubled the score on Milton 4-2 Sunday at Memorial Arena.

Hood was the major marksman against Brampton adding two assists to his unassisted goals to spark the club.

After a scoreless first period, Alan James notched his fifth of the season just 29 seconds into the second period. Tracy Harding and Hood assisted.

Brampton capitalized on a double minor assessed to Bruce Syer to notch a pair of power-play goals midway through the frame to take a onegoal lead into the final stanza.

However, Hood erased the disadvantage with his two goals to put Milton ahead to stay. Syer added an insurance goal 29 seconds from the end of the game with Brampton playing two men short. Goalkeepers Shawn Carnegie and Kurt Acker-

mann shared Milton's netminding duties. It was a different story the next day as Ching outshot Milton 26-11 in the game and led 4-1 until late in the contest.

Ching opened the scoring 32 seconds into the first period. Syer notched the equalizer two minutes later with Paul Wilson and Harding pick-

ing up assists. With 47 seconds left in the period, Ching struck

again to take a lead they didn't relinquish. Ching upped the lead to 4-1 until Kevin Luoma cut the margin to two goals with an unassisted goal with 1.06 to play in the game.

JB Stable is quietly on top

Hold on to your hats folks-it looks like we're in for an interesting season of action in the Milton Hockey League.

Pre-season predictions of a much-improved and more-balanced calibre in the league has held out for the first two weeks of the season. That alone has helped to warm the spectators who have needed to brave frigid weather conditions inside the bitterly cold Milton Sports Centre by getting vocally involved in all the games.

Still short several key regulars, John Burns Stable has emerged as the early frontrunner. The club established and fortified its position on top with a systematic execution of Miltowne Realty by a 5-2 score Sunday.

In other games, The Racer's Edge and Lou's Place Hawks played to a 2-2 draw while Straight Line Fence squeezed out a 3-2 decision over Milton Chrysler-Dodge in a contest which called 42 seconds from the end of the game when a major brawl

erupted on the ice. Certainly the most cleanly played contest of the night featured Burns Stable and Miltowne. Just nine minors were called in the game which did not approach the physical level of the other two

Burns erased some fears the club may have traded away all its scoring potential by taking command against Miltowne.

JB Stable traded Don Habkirk and Buddy Thomas, its two top scorers from a year ago. But the additions of Todd Corradetti, Dave Heipel, Dave Harnden and Lester Wilson has so far appeared to more than offset the loss of Habkirk and Thomas.

JB Stable wasted little time getting on the board when Corradetti drove home his fourth goal of the young season just three minutes into the contest to put his club ahead 1-0. Dave Arbic assisted on the

Miltowne evened the score 50 seconds from the end of the opening period. Brad Roelofson potted a goal from Al Duncan and John Dent.

In the middle frame, JB Stable went to work on Miltowne goalie Glen Horney scoring four goals to take a commanding lead.

Paul Mountain made it 2-1 just 28 seconds into the second period. Heipel did much of the work on the pretty play setting up Mountain on a two-onone break. Jay Norland also assisted.

A minute later. Arbic made it 3-1 with linemates Ron Armstrong and Randy Coulson picking up assists. Just two minutes later, JB Stable established a three-goal lead when Les Wilson

poked home the puck from a scramble. Harnden and Norland assisted.

Miltowne quickly reduced the disadvantage to two when Bob Baker made a nice move just inside the blue line and nailed a drive into the top corner of the net surprising Stable netminder Phil Bailey.

However, with two minutes left in the period, defenceman Roger Clement blasted home a slapshop from the blue line to regain its three-goal lead and JB Stable was on its way. Arbic, who had a three-point night, and Armstrong assisted.

The third period was played without a score. In fact, it was played two minutes short as the 9.30 p.m. curfew was called into action. The length of the previous game forced the shortening of the second game.

The first game of the evening was a close contest with no incidents until the final minute. Chrysler's Gord Lyons, in his first-ever MHL game, became involved in a brawl with Straight Line goalkeeper Ed House.

When House was out of his goal crease, Lyons ran a little interference on the goalie. Harry Rowlands came to his goalie's aid and battled with Lyons. House then resumed his brawl with Lyons, even though Rowlands hadn't yet finished. Within seconds, the rest of the players on the ice

began brawling. When it was all over, all 11

players on the ice (Chrysler had one man in the penalty box at the time) were ejected from the game. As a result, all 11 players will also be suspended for one game as well. Straight Line players involved were Ian Wan-

less, Steve Hannon, George Ball, Don Habkirk, House and Rowlands. Gone for Chrysler-Dodge are Peter Rota, Pat Haggart, Steve Wilson, Mitch Lajeunesse and Lyons. Further suspensions could follow after a league review.

In the game, Straight Line scored twice in a one minute span in the second period to break a 1-1 tie and take a lead it didn't relinquish. Chrysler scored midway through the third period to close the gap to a single tally but couldn't press further for the equalizer.

Bill Lyons, Brad Nadalin and Rowlands scored for Straight Line with Rob Champoux garnering the lone assist for his club.

Bill Goencz and Lajeunesse fired singles for Chrysler with Gord Lyons picking up two assists and Wilson earning one.

In the final game of the evening, Lou's Place goalkeeper Ron Rowlin sparkled between the pipes to help his club to a 2-2 draw with The Racer's Edge.

Lou's Place was without several key players

(Guy McGinnis, Gord Adams, Jim Cartwright among them) but inspired by Rowlin's standout goalkeeping held on for the tie.

Rowlin was named the Molson player of the night for his effort and was full marks for the honor. The only goals which beat him resulted when his teammates gave away the puck in their own zone giving Richard Murray and Mike Mur-

ray easy shots for goals which they converted. The teams played through the first period and seven minutes of the middle frame without a goal before Lou D'Arzio's wrist shot to the top corner beat The Edge netminder Al Horney cleanly. Rick

Bridgman assisted. Two minutes later, Richard Murray picked up an errant pass from the corner in the slot and drilled a wrist shot past Rowlin.

Three minutes into the third period, Mike Murray capitalized on another Hawk miscue for The Edge's second goal. Peter McCuaig assisted.

However, Henry Nadalin tallied the equalizer when he finished off a nice play after D'Arzio and Bridgman had done much of the spadework in the

The teams played through the final 11 minutes of the game without a goal but not without incident. With five minutes left in the game, Mike Murray and Bridgman got into a small high-sticking duel in front of the Edge's goal. Eric Ellison came to Murray's aid and was promptly pinned to the ice by Bridgman who showed everyone that although his hockey skills are showing the effects of a oneyear layoff, his physical capabilities haven't diminished.

Lou's Place also got themselves in trouble when defenceman John Leoprich's stick was proven to be illegal. The call enabled The Edge to go on the power play for the final minute and 44 seconds. However, Rowlin made several good stops and The Edge couldn't mount much in the way of a pressing power play enabling the game to end in a

Slashes-John Burns' rightwinger Todd Corradetti was named player of the night for the opening night of the season. Teammate Bob Rusk returns to action next week after serving both games of a suspension he incurred in last year's championship playoffs.

-Miltowne goalkeeper Mike Shepherd hasn't seen any action because of damaged knee ligaments. He might suit up to play next week.


-The heat hasn't yet been turned on for the spectators. It was warmer outside the arena. Sales of coffee and hot chocolate were brisk, to say






