Steenhof tops midget runners leading the parade in first place

Any person whose name is entered on the polling list for a polling subdivision or who has obtained a certificate entitling him to vote and who is:

- a person other than one who is in a hospital or other institution, where a polling place has been provided on such premises for the purpose of polling or where provision has been made to attend upon such persons for the purpose of receiving their ballot (Halton Centennial Manor); and
- a person who is certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner, by certificate filed with the Clerk Co-ordinator, to be physically incapable of attending a polling place;
- a person absent from his regular residence by reason of attending an educational institution and who is entered in the list for the polling subdivision in which he normally resides and who expects by reason of such absence to be unable to vote at the advance polls or on polling day; or
- a person who expects to be absent from his polling subdivision during the election period including the advance polls and polling day by reason of his being engaged for hire or reward in the business of transportation by railway, air, water or motor vehicle.

may vote by proxy in that polling subdivision.

Any person who is entitled to vote by proxy, above noted, may appoint in writing in the prescribed form, available at the Office of the Returning Officer, 251 Main Street East, Milton, as his voting proxy any other person who is eligible as an elector in the Municipality.

Such persons must be appointed and certified by the Clerk Co-ordinator of Milton during the period following Nomination Day (October 19th, 1982 to 5:00 p.m. on Polling Day, November 8th, 1982).

AROUND THE HOUSE

Don't throw away old plastic "bubble" umbrellas. Remove the handle, push the center pole in the ground, and you have a great miniature greenhouse for starting seedlings and cuttings.

You can make your own meat tenderizer by combining half a cup of vinegar with one cup of beef broth.

To remove candle stubs from long stemmed glass candle holders, fill the stems with hot soapy water and let stand for about 30 minutes. Then insert a utpick into the stub and it will lift right out.

When frying bacon, hamburgers, or other meat, insert cotton balls into the pan. This allows steam to escape but keeps splattering grease inside.

If you are drying only a few shirts in your drier, throw in a clean bath towel. It will absorb moisture and the clothes will dry faster.
