

# Optis succeed in week

Milton Optimist minor peewees had another busy, but successful three-day gambit. The first action of the weekend matched the squad up against Flamboro. In their previous game Milton had edged Flamboro out 4-3. Jason Blanchard opened the scoring before the first minute had elapsed, assisted by Scott McLeod. Although the team put a lot of pressure on and around the Flamboro net, it was Flamboro who came back to tie the game up. With just 30 seconds left in the period, Shawn Healey fed a perfect pass to Robby Mifsud who fired home the go-ahead goal.

Milton continued to go ahead, but it wasn't until halfway through the second period they were able to add to their total. A three-man effort clinched the game for them with Richard Bray netting the goal and Blanchard and Hasselheldt assisting.

Healey scored the only goal of the third period, unassisted, to assure that they could do more than just edge Flamboro out of a win.

Sunday saw Optimists against Brampton in their first match-up of the season.

The Milton team outshot Brampton 22-5, giving goalie Greg Rae a bit of a rest, after yesterday allowing Flamboro only one goal.

All their efforts in the first period to score didn't pay off. Either Brampton's goalie was outstanding, or the net was too low, or too narrow, or the post too wide, or there was some invisible shield preventing them.

It wasn't until early in the second period that Mark French was able to break through this shield to score with Mifsud's assistance. Now that the shield had been broken nothing could stop them. Chris Fabbro, unassisted, netted the team's second goal while short-handed.

Brampton was given an opportunity in the third period to score while two Milton players sat in the box, but some strong defensive work from Milton prevented any attempt. Healey wrapped the game up on assists from Bray and Finch to give them a 3-0 victory.

Monday night, the team was back in Orangeville to rectify a problem. The problem, Orangeville has been the only team to beat Optimists on a close 3-2 win.

Things didn't look too promising in the first period as Orangeville got on the scoreboard first while short-handed. Milton came back with just over a minute left to tie the game on a goal by Healey with Finch assisting.

Orangeville took the lead again in the second period on a scramble in front of the net, but Healey came back again with just 42 seconds left to tie the game up, unassisted.

Milton began to rectify their problem in the third period when they took the lead for the first time. Healey scored his third of the night on a re-

bound from Lee Finch's shot. Blanchard added an assurance goal, unassisted, before Orangeville came back to close the gap at 4-3. With just 12 seconds left in the game, French solved the problem of who would win by scoring the team's fifth goal with assists to Mifsud and Healey.

# Summer Games reborn for provincial athletes

Minister of Tourism and Recreation Reuben Baetz recently announced the re-birth of the Ontario Summer Games and the initiation of the Canada Games trials for Ontario amateur athletes.

In addition, he said, young athletes hoping to represent Ontario at the Canada Games—to be held in the Lac St. Jean region of Quebec beginning February 17—will be brought together for the Ontario Canada Games Trials, December 28 to 30 at Etobicoke. "The trials will involve about 450 athletes, coaches and managers and they will provide an important forum for training, for final team selection for some sports and for building the all-important 'esprit de corps,'" the minister said.

In addition to the new sports initiatives, Baetz congratulated the Canadian athletes who participated in the recent games. As proof that Ontario's sports development programs are bearing fruit, the minister pointed out that 87 of the 185-member team which represented Canada at the Commonwealth Games was made up of Ontario athletes.

Speaking to the Ontario Legislature this afternoon, Mr. Baetz said the next Ontario Summer Games would be held in Sudbury in September, 1983. "We suspended these games a few years ago so that we could thoroughly analyze their place in our program," said Mr. Baetz. "We are now certain that these games are important in our sports development program. They are a stepping stone on the road to athletic achievement."
