## Welfare recipients get a raise from Bill Davis

recipients be getting a raise this month, thanks to the government.

provincial Ministry of Community and Social Services recently announced increases in the amounts to be paid under the General Welfare Assistance Act.

Under the terms of the increase, the rate for a single, employable recipient goes to \$313 a month from \$266.

The rate for a family with two children goes te \$660 from \$608. Rates for singles women with children will range between \$490 and \$623 per month.

report to members of Halton's health and social services committee, director Debbie Oakley said the increases would cost the Region about \$5,000 because welfare payments are 80 per cent subsidized by the pro-

The increases amount to five per cent for all recipients, except those renting rooms or boarding with members immediate family.

addition, single employable clients received another \$11 a month, if they don' live with their families. The shelter subsidy was increased by \$25 to cover a wider range of costs, the rates for foster children were increased by 14 per cent and the special allowance paid to pregnant recipients was increased by \$1 to \$16 a month.




