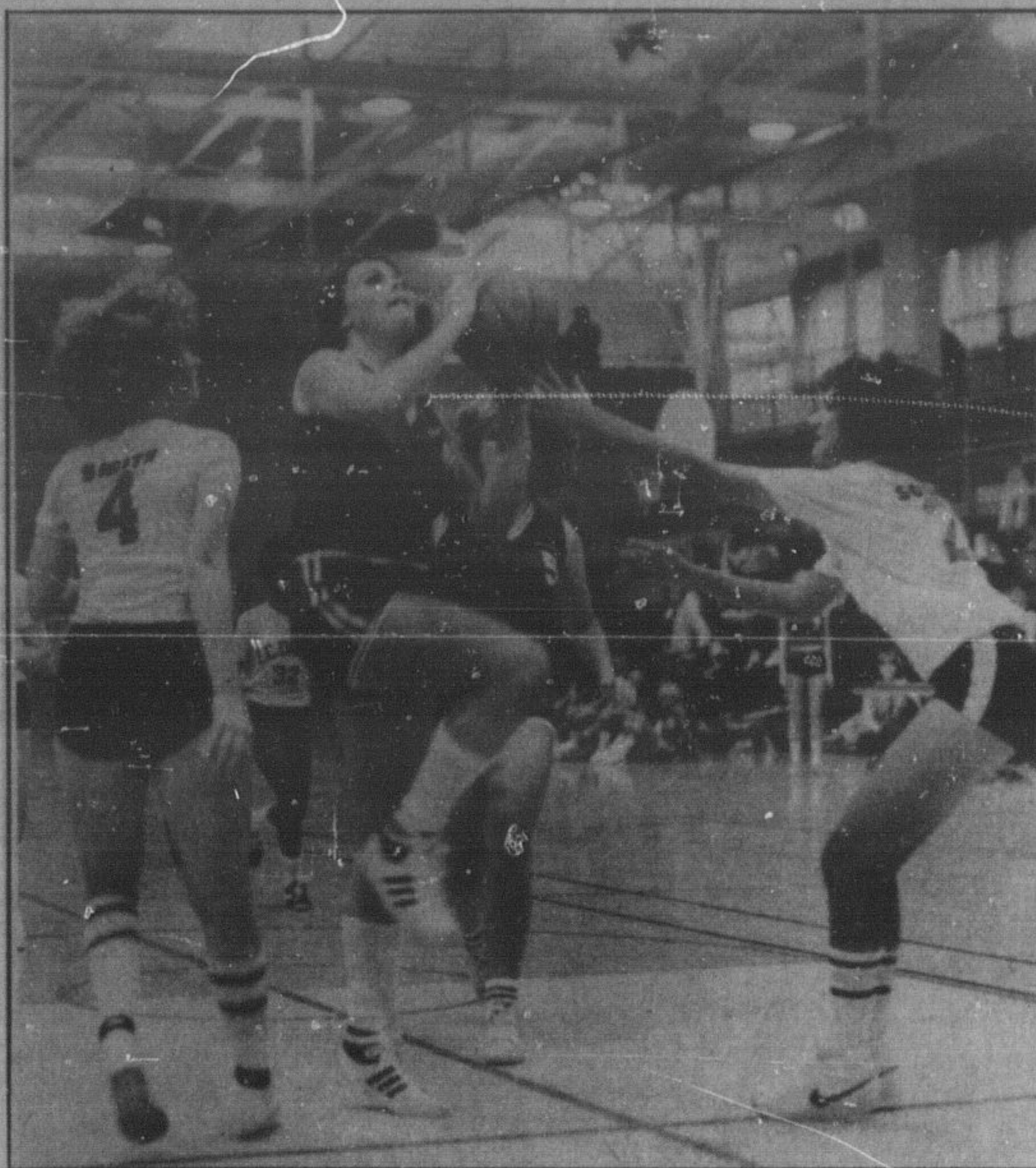


but lost a close match 19-18. Aldershot was the next opponent. Milton literally blew them off the floor with a score of 26-4.
